Featured in the rodeo will be 1) saddle bronc, entry fee \$25; 2) bareback, entry fee of \$25; 3) calf roping, entry fee of \$25; 4) barrel racing, entry fee of \$25; 5) junior barrels, (12 and under); entry fee of \$10; 6) team roping, (two loops, entry twice) entry fee of \$25 per man; 7) cowgirls breakaway roping, entry fee of \$25; 8) wild cow milking, entry fee of \$25; 9) wild horse race, (limit of eight teams per day) entry fee of \$75 per team; and, 10) calf scramble (10 and under) with no entry fee.

cond place with at time of 17.11 minutes and received \$35, a trophy and jacket.

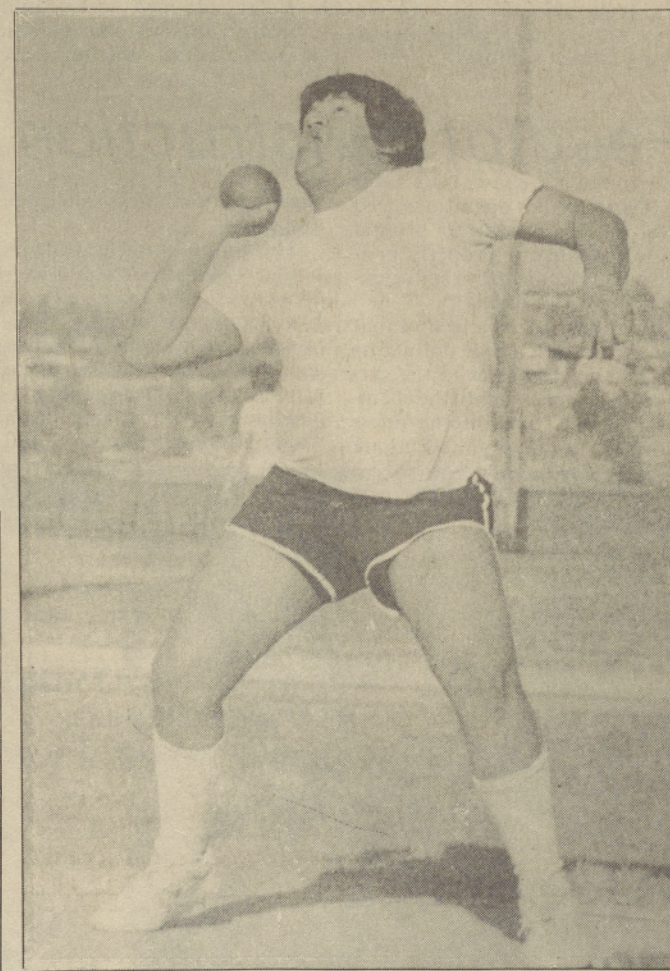
Joe Scott, Warm Springs received the sportsmanship award and received a \$10 gift certificate from Olson's Saddlery Shop in Madras.
