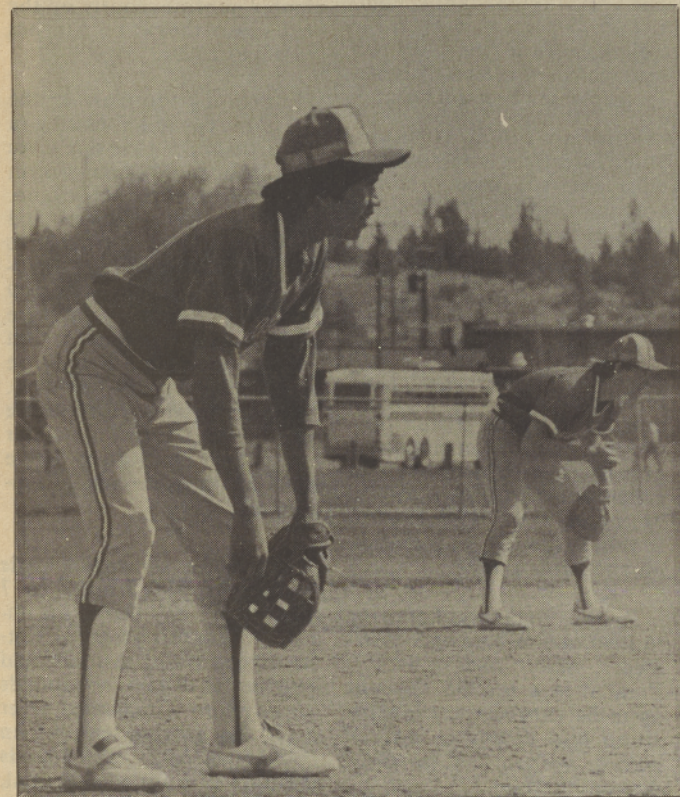
come to attend.

Jackpot rodeo slated for May 11, 12

The Warm Springs rodeo association is sponsoring a jackpot rodeo Saturday, May 11 and Sunday May 12 at the Warm Springs rodeo grounds.

Featured in the rodeo will be 1) saddle bronc, entry fee \$25; 2) bareback, entry fee of \$25; 3) calf roping, entry fee of \$25; 4) barrel racing, entry fee of \$25; 5) junior barrels, (12 and under); entry fee of \$10; 6) team roping, (two loops, enter twice) entry fee of \$25 per man; 7) cowgirls breakaway roping, entry fee of \$25; 8) wild cow milking, entry fee of \$25; 9) wild horse race, (limit of eight teams per day) entry fee of \$75 per team; and, 10) calf scramble (10 and under) with no entry fee.

The rodeo books are open and early entries are being taken. Mail entries to Evaline Patt, rodeo secretary, P.O. Box 27,

Warm Springs, Oregon 97761. Send only money orders or cashiers checks, no personal checks will be accepted. Make all checks payable to the Warm Springs Rodeo Association. Cowboys can enter at the rodeo office both Saturday, May 11 and Sunday, May 12, the books will close at 11 a.m. on those days. Entries mailed in must be received by the rodeo office by Friday, May 10.

A \$5 office charge will be drawn from each entry.

Admission for the rodeo will be \$3 for adults; \$1.50 for children, 12 and under; and free for Senior citizens. There will be no passes provided for contestant's spouses or children.

Featured during the two day celebration will be a western States Indian Rodeo Association All-Indian Rodeo, Indian dancing, a Arts and Crafts Show, a parade in downtown Klamath Falls, and a beef bar-b-que.

The rodeo events will be saddle bronc with a \$200 added purse and entry fee \$40; bareback with a purse of \$200 and entry fee of \$40; bull riding with a purse of \$200 and entry fee of \$40; calf roping with a purse of \$100 and entry fee of \$40; wild cow milking with a purse of \$100 and entry fee of \$40; team roping (two gos) with a purse of \$100 and entry fee of \$40 per man; kids steer riding with a \$5

entry fee; open hide race with a purse of \$50 and entry fee of \$10; wild horse race with a purse of \$200 and \$40 entry fee per team; and barrel race with a purse of \$100 and entry fee of \$40.

Roping scheduled for summer

A team roping series will be held at the Wasco County Fair grounds in Tygh Valley on May 25; June 1, 15, 29; July 20; August 3, 17, 23; and September 7, 21. For a roper to qualify for the buckle series they must attend four out of five ropings which fall on May 25, June 1, July 20, August 3 and September 7.

The novice class is for those who have earned \$500 and under, lifetime, women and over 55 years of age. Roping for novice class will cost three for \$15. Open roping will cost three for \$20 and is for those who have

not won over \$5,000 within the last three years.

Open barrel racing will also be held at the roping with the winner-taking-all.

Signup time will be 6 p.m. with the roping to start at 7 p.m.

Practice roping will be held on Wednesdays and Sundays at the Tygh Valley All-Indian Rodeo grounds. Signup for Wednesdays will start at 5 p.m. and on Sundays signup is 12 p.m. with roping starting at 1 p.m.

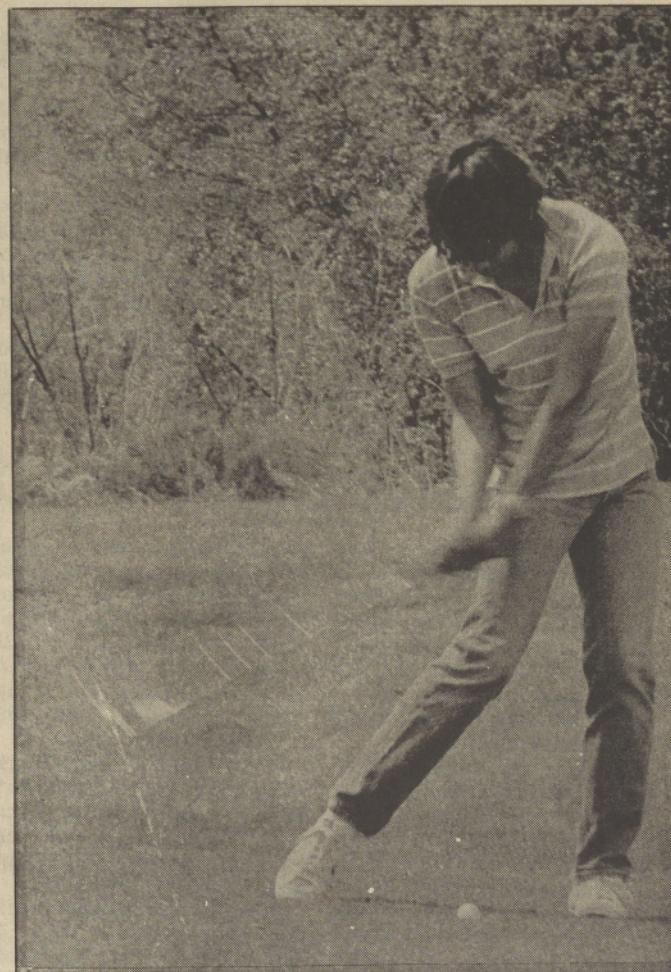
Events for the rodeo are: saddle bronc, purse \$500, entry fee \$45; bareback, purse \$450, entry fee \$45; bull riding, purse \$450, entry fee \$45, open to the first 32 paid entries; bull dogging, purse \$400, entry fee \$45; calf roping, purse \$400, entry fee \$45; team roping, purse \$400, entry fee \$90 per team, two loops, must enter as a team one go round; bareback riding for girls and boys 15 and under, purse \$200, entry fee \$30, open to the first 16 entries; girls barrel race, purse \$400, entry fee \$45; wild horse race, purse \$200 per day, entry fee \$45 per team, first eight entered, no set ups or

trade outs. Buckles will be awarded in all events.

Entries opened May 3 and will close May 15. Mail entries to Ginger Johnson, Rodeo Secretary, P.O. Box 541, Warm Springs, Oregon 97761. Enclose entry fees or WSIRA card number, send fees in form of money order, no checks or Canadian money will be accepted. For telephone entries call (503) 553-1750 between the hours of 5:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. Hometown and permit holders must have entry fees paid by May 15 and permits must be purchased by noon Saturday May 18. All phone entries must have a current WSIRA card to enter.
