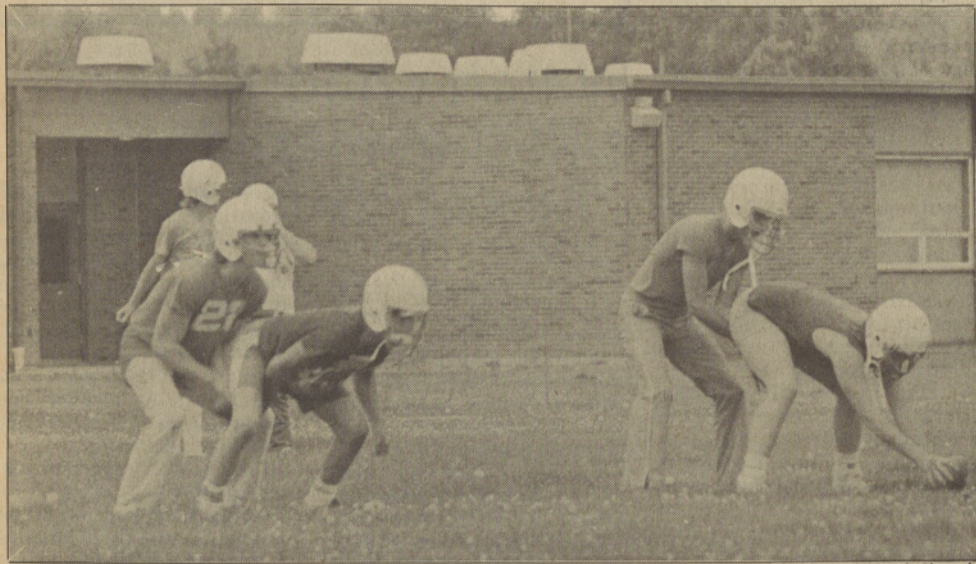

Athletic eligibility rules change WSIRA finals scheduled for Sept. 21-22



Football practice brought Madras High School students back to school early.

To be eligible for inter-scholastic athletics at Madras High School, students must be on track for graduation and conform to all O.S.A.A. rules and regulations. Being on track for graduation means the student has time available on the regular schedule to pass all required courses. Any senior student must be passing in all subjects necessary for that student to graduate.

In addition, the following building rules shall apply: Every student will be required to attend regularly and be passing in six (6) subjects. In addition, during the immediately preceding semester, he/she must have been enrolled in school, attended regularly and passed six (6) subjects.

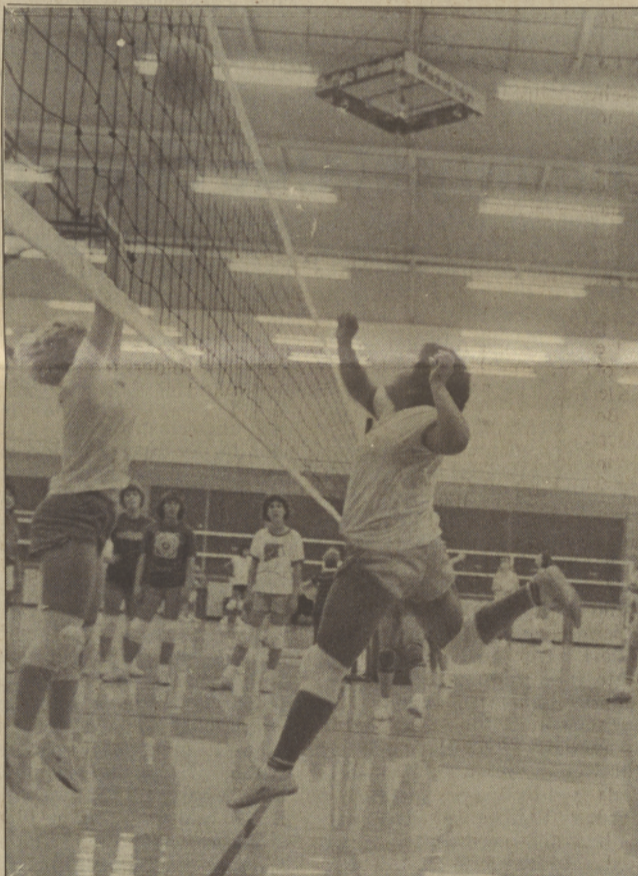
1.0 To determine the "be passing" portion of the rule, a check of grades and attendance will be made at mid-quarter. This check will cause the activities director and coach to warn students that they must be passing six (6) subjects at the end of the quarter.

1.1 As soon as report cards are available, the activities director will check to determine who in the student body is not currently passing six (6) subjects at the end of quarters one and three.

1.2 Students will be informed that they are ineligible if they are not passing six (6) subjects that carry credit at the end of quarters one and three.

1.3 The period of ineligibility will be for 14 calendar days beginning the day the student is notified.

1.4 At the end of the 14 day period of ineligibility, a check will be made of all students determined to be ineligible. If, at that time, the student's grades (semester) are passing in six (6) or more subjects, the student will be determined eligible until the end of the semester. If the student is not passing in six (6)

or more subjects, he/she will be ruled ineligible until the end of the semester.

1.5 If a student is determined ineligible at the end of quarters two and four, that student will remain ineligible until the end of the next semester.

2.0 To determine "attending regularly" students will be ruled ineligible should they get 12 or more absences per semester in any two or more classes, including study halls.

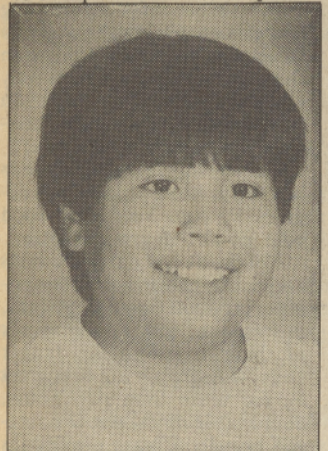
3.0 Students who have been ruled ineligible shall still have the opportunity to try out for

and practice with their respective teams. This opportunity will be granted only one time during a student's high school career. Any student being ineligible a second time will not be allowed to practice nor participate with their respective teams.

4.0 The above conditions are subject to an appeals process with the building administrator and/or the O.S.A.A. where exceptions may be made should an unusual or extreme situation occur that caused the student to become ineligible.

Entry fees per event are \$75 with team roping being \$75 per man with an added purse of \$1,000 in each event and the team roping added purse of \$2,000. There will be two goes in each event. A contestant fee of \$7 will be charged and in barrel racing contestants will pay an additional \$1 fee for the electric eye.

The Calcutta Saturday night will be at Karl's Casino in bulls, broncs, barrels and team roping.

The membership deadline is September 7, 1985. Any dues received after this date will be

Kester headed for bigger wins

After placing first in the 1985 Endurance Race at Warm Springs 15-year-old John Kester continues reaching for the winner's circle. His love for horses and interest in riding is directing him down the path to big-time horse racing.

By the time John is 16 he hopes to be donning silks and riding winners across the finish line. Until then he will be working with \$20,000 thoroughbreds owned by Roland Ferguson.

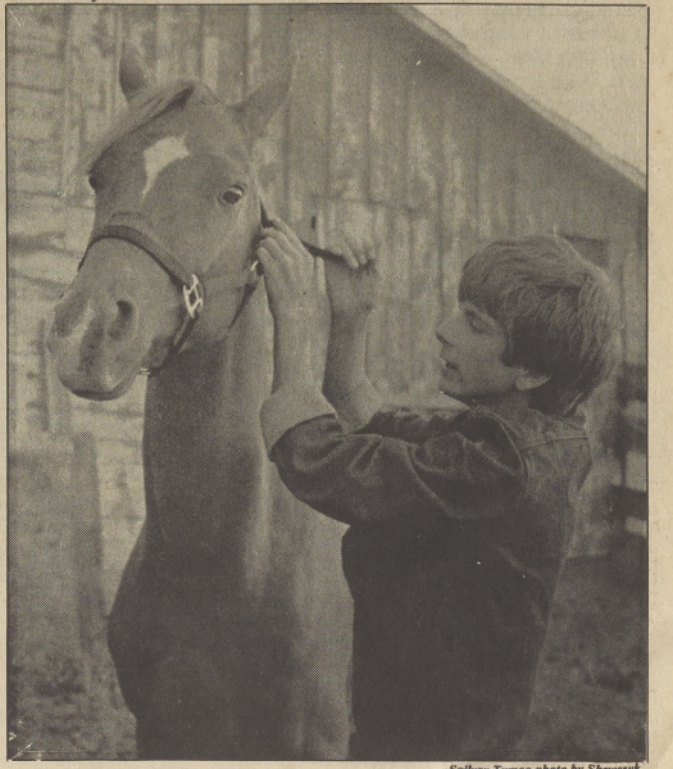
Introduced to Ferguson by Delson Suppah, John has been galloping horses for him since the beginning of the summer. He also cleans stalls and is basically "becoming familiar with horses."

Throughout the upcoming school year John will be staying with the Fergusons in Vancouver, Washington, going to school and working horses at a nearby training stable.

With added experience by his sixteenth birthday next June, John will be testing for his jockey's license. According to John the test consists of riding out of the gates in front of the stewards, switching leads and switching the whip from hand to hand. He must maintain a weight of less than 120 pounds. "The lighter you are, the better," he adds.

John has been actively riding in his own back yard for five years. He finished third at the 1984 Dayville Endurance race

and placed second in the Warm Springs Endurance race in 1984 before his victory in the 1985 race.
