Energy concerns

Q. I just moved into a house that has black plastic over the ground in the crawl space underneath the house. Does it save energy? Should I leave it there?
A. Yes, leave it there. The black plastic doesn't save energy, but it is important. It's a vapor barrier to prevent water from evaporating from the soil. If water evaporates into the crawl space, rot can form in the wood and mildew can grow inside the house. A vapor barrier in the crawl space is especially important when the floor is insulated. The vapor barrier should be black polyethylene, 6 mils thick. Make sure that sheets overlap by 12 inches where they come together and that they extend all the way to the foundation footings. Weight the sheets down with rocks or bricks.
