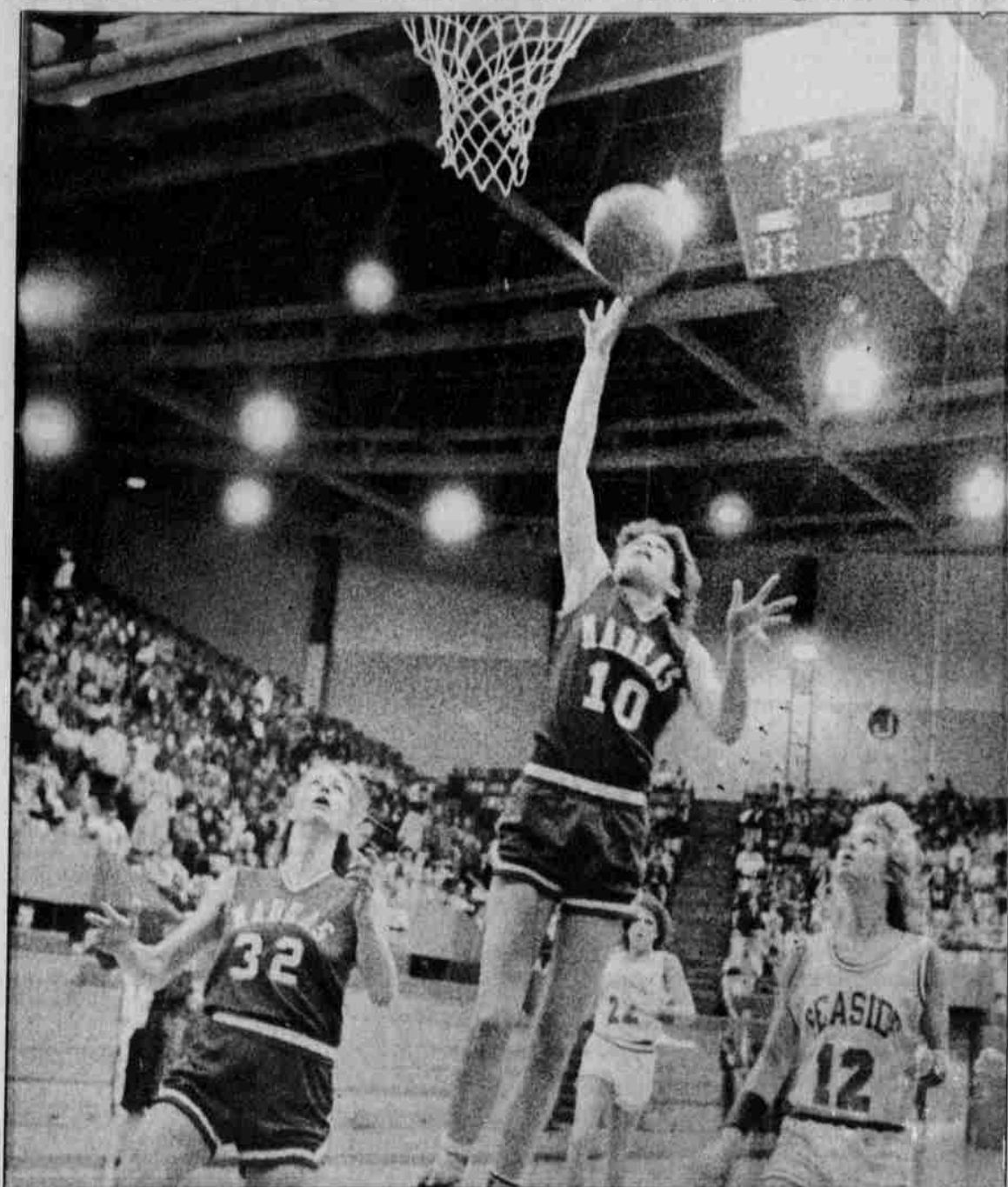

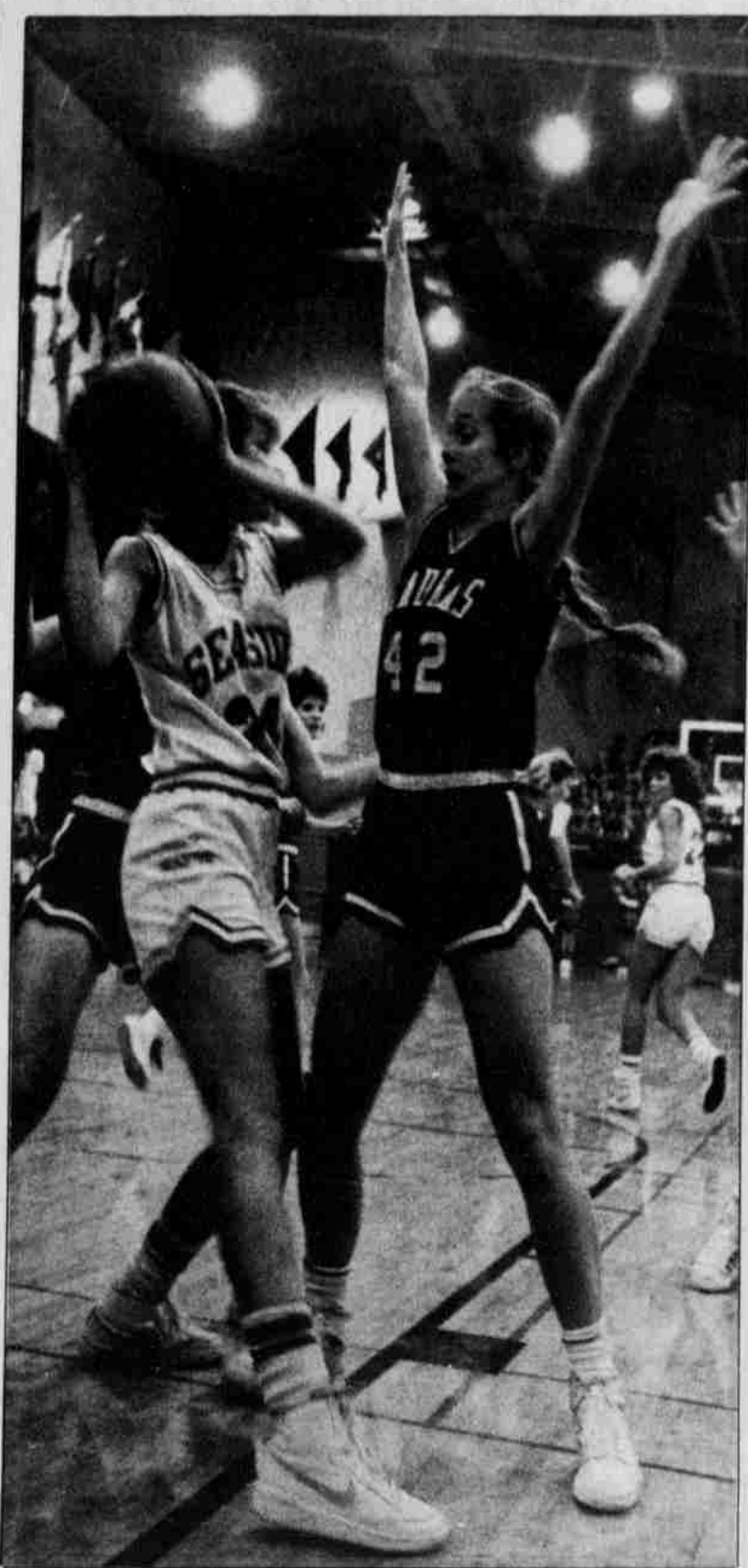

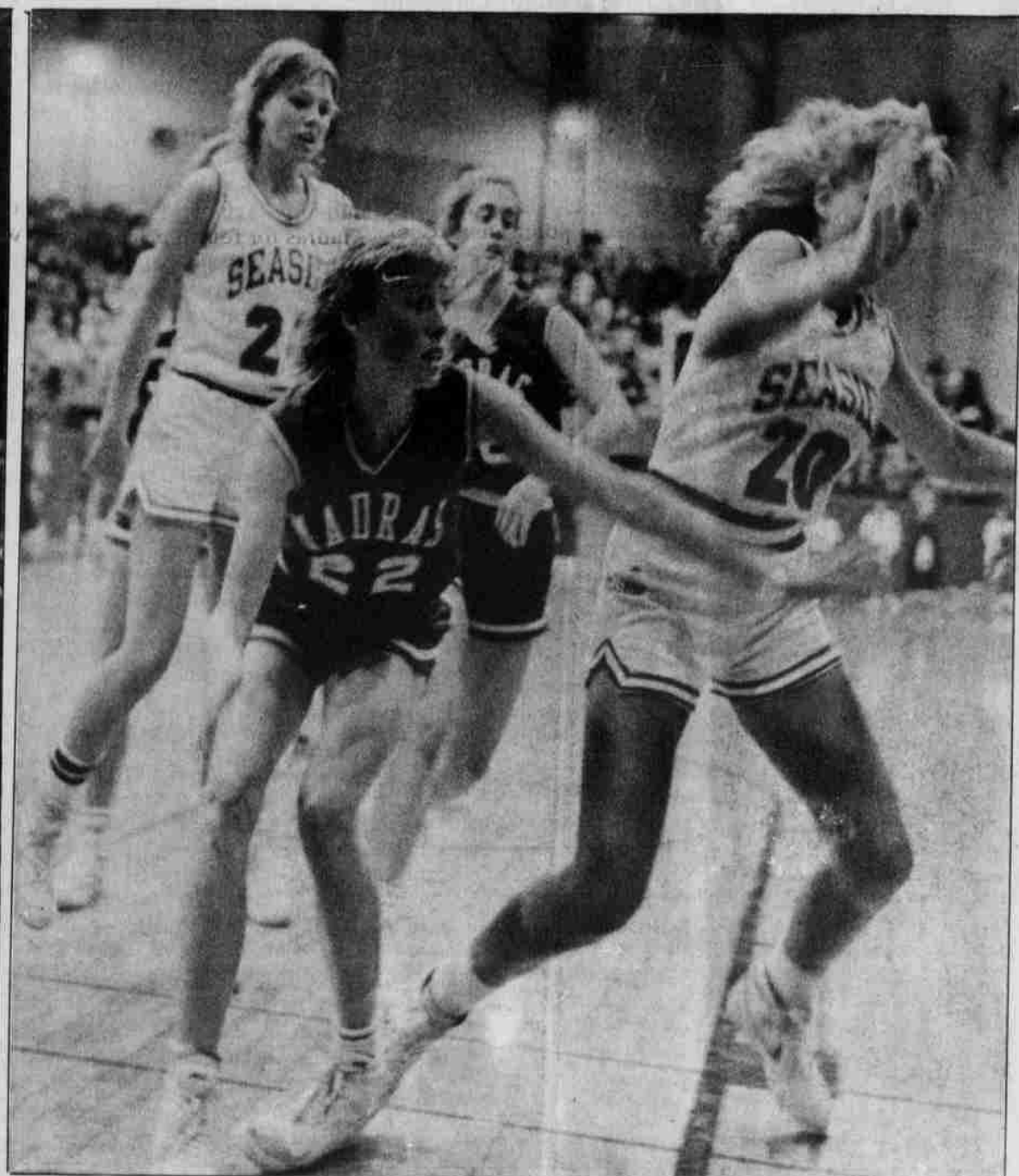

Boxers win championship

Seven members of the Warm Springs Boxing Club traveled to Salem to participate in the Northwest Tournament of Champions February 22 and 23.

Five WSBC boxers won championships in their divisions. James Teeman—12-13 years, 70 lbs. division; Frank Brunoe—75 lbs. division; Eldred Heath—100 lbs. division; and Delbert Lawson—14-15 years, 125 lbs.

Tom Marchand, Warm Springs, was eliminated in the quarter-finals of the 178 lbs. special senior division.

Sonny James was the runner-up in the 12-13 years, 125 lbs. division.

WSBC boxers traveled to the Ninth Annual Tacoma Golden Gloves tournament March 1 and 2. WSBC members again

showed great strength winning four championship titles, one runner-up and a semi-finalist. James Teeman won the 12-13 year old 75 lbs. division; Jeremy Lagars took the 12-13 year old 112 lbs. division title; Eldred Heath won the 14-15 year old 100 lbs. title and Delbert Lawson earned the 14-15 year old 125 lbs. division. Runner-up in the 12-13 year old division was Sonny James. Tom Marchand was a semi-finalist special senior 165 lbs. division.

Boxing matches will come to the Warm Springs community on April 19 and 20 with the Buckskin Boxing Championships to be held at the Community Center. Boxers from throughout the West have been invited to attend and participate in the annual event.

Memorial tournament set for April 4-6

The Second Annual W.S. Tribes Players' Memorial basketball tournament will begin on Friday, April 4 through Sunday April 6, 1986. Eight ladies teams and 8-12 men's teams will compete in this double elimination tournament—championship winners will receive custom-made Pendleton coats.

The name "Players' Memorial" resulted in a decision to honor our Indian athletes who have passed on. Locally, Aaron Mitchell, Byron Patt and Vernon Tanewasha will be remembered. Names are also being submitted from other reservations in our region.

Tournament entry fee is set at \$160 (a \$60 deposit will guarantee

consideration). Although no deposits have been received, a few verbal confirmations include: (men) Simnasho Travelers; (ladies) Inter-Tribal Sports of Oregon; Portland, Oregon; and Nanaimo, B.C., Canada.

In the first Annual Invitational, the Men's Most Valuable Player was dedicated to Aaron Mitchell, a scholar athlete who graduated from Madras High School in 1974. An "Aaron Mitchell Memorial" scholarship is now being drafted for M.H.S. graduates beginning with the 1986-87 school year. Some requirements will include: 1. At least 1/4 degree Indian blood. 2. At least 2.5 grade point average. 3. Must be involved in extra-curricular

activities (i.e. sports, music, art, etc.). 4. Filled application—which will be available through the counseling office and/or the tribal education department.

The tournament awards will be custom made by Inter Tribal Sports service. The tournament committee is now seeking sponsors to cover these costs, as well as costs for tournament officials, and player meals on Saturday and Sunday.
