When I see this first sign of autumn, I know that I have to get busy and start planning my visits to the about themselves or even learn

I'm not sure all of us realize how important it is to get children going on good health habits, dental and otherwise, when they're young. It doesn't take long for young people to become just like the rest of usset in our ways. Now, that's not necessarily a bad thing if your "ways" happen to be healthy ones. On the other hand, if your habits include not eating good foods, not exercising, or not brushing your teeth, it will be very hard to change them. Not impossible, just hard. 
It's very easy to not care and take
