

# Fostering good habits takes work

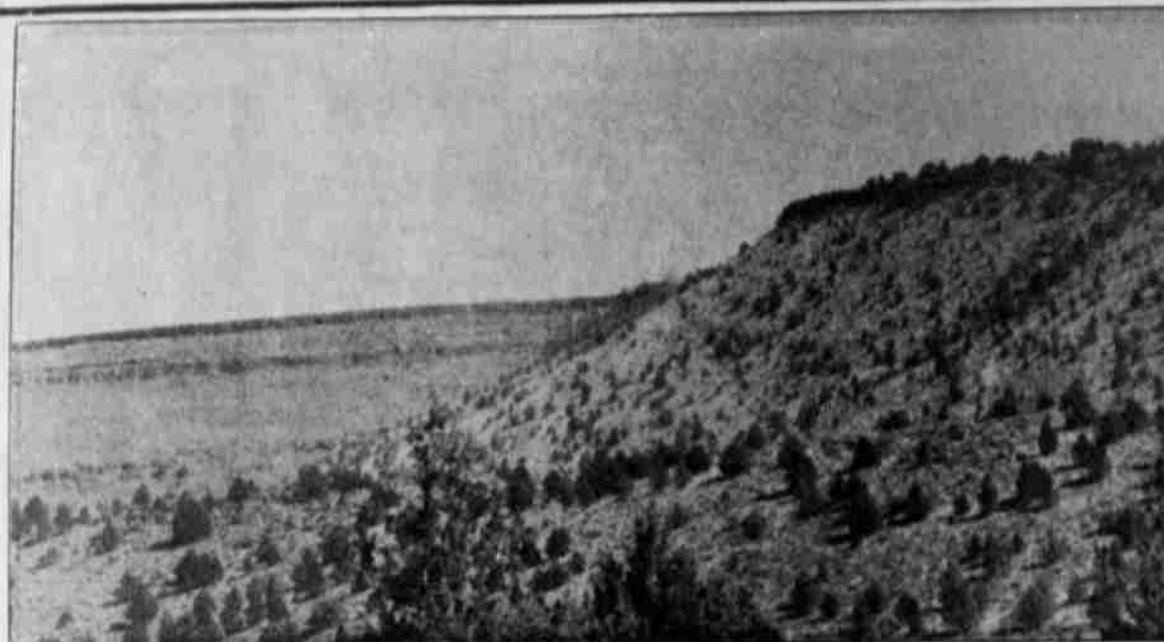

My calendar says that the official end of summer isn't until a week or so from now, but I know that summer really ended last week. It ended the day the kids went to school. When I see this first sign of autumn, I know that I have to get busy and start planning my visits to the

grade school. It's my one chance to try to get kids interested in their health.  
I'm not sure all of us realize how important it is to get children going on good health habits, dental and otherwise, when they're young. It doesn't take long for young people to become just like the rest of us—set in our ways. Now, that's not necessarily a bad thing if your "ways" happen to be healthy ones. On the other hand, if your habits include not eating good foods, not exercising, or not brushing your teeth, it will be very hard to change them. Not impossible, just hard.  
One of the problems is that good habits generally involve more work and more caring about yourself. It's very easy to not care and take the lazy way out. Somehow, I'm not sure kids can learn to care about themselves or even learn

good habits in three half-hour lessons. Children may be all excited about brushing and flossing when they get out of school, but they'll need continuing support when they get home. If the kids are spending their evenings with folks who really don't care about teeth, my lessons are pretty much a waste of time. Parents are still the most influential teachers.  
This year, let's try to support the efforts of all our community health advocates when they try to teach the young about staying healthy. Whether the messages be about teeth, drugs, alcohol, tobacco or nutrition, try to reinforce good habits to the kids. Do it in a positive way and not as just "one more thing to do." Let's hope our children can avoid some of the mistakes we have made.

# Environmental Impact statement determined unnecessary for building addition

Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs Tribal Administration Building, Tenino Road, Post Office Box C, Warm Springs, Oregon 97761, 553-1161. To all interested agencies, groups and persons:  
On or about September 29, 1986 the above-named Tribe will request the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to release Federal funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (PL 93-383) for the following project:  
Warm Springs Apparel Enterprise Building Addition and Expansion.  
Expand Floor Space for Apparel Enterprise Operations.  
Warm Springs, Jefferson County, Oregon (Industrial Park).  
Warm Springs Indian Reservation.

It has been determined that such request for release of funds will not constitute an action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment and accordingly the above-named Tribe has decided not to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (PL 91-190).  
The reasons for such decision not to prepare such Statement are as follows:  
No potentially adverse impacts have been identified as a result of the proposed building addition and business expansion.  
And Environmental Review Record respecting the within project has been made by the above-named Tribe which documents the environmental review of the project and more fully sets forth the reasons why such Statement is not required.

This Environmental Review Record is on file at the above address and is available for public examination and copying upon request at the tribal planning office between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on weekdays.  
No further environmental review of such project is proposed to be conducted prior to the request for release of Federal funds.  
All interested agencies, groups and persons disagreeing with this decision are invited to submit written comments for consideration by the Tribe to the office of the undersigned. Such written comments should be received at the address specified on or before September 29, 1986. All such comments so received will be considered and the Tribe will not request the release of Federal Funds or take any administrative action on the within project prior to the

date specified in the preceding sentence.  
The Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs will undertake the project described above with Block Grant funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. The Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs is certifying to HUD that The Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs and Larry Calica, Secretary-Treasurer of the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs, in his official capacity as Secretary-Treasurer consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to environmental reviews, decision-making and action; and that these

responsibilities have been satisfied. The legal effect of the certification is that upon its approval the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs may use the Block Grant funds and HUD will have satisfied its responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969. HUD will accept an objection to its approval only if it is on one of the following basis: (a) that the certification was not in fact executed by the certifying officer or other officer of applicant approved by HUD; or (b) that applicant environmental review record for the project indicates omission of a required decision finding or step applicable to the project in the environmental review process. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedure (24 CFR Part 58) and may be addressed to HUD at the Office of

Indian Programs, Seattle Regional Office, Arcade Plaza Building, 1321 Second Avenue, Seattle, Washington 98101-2054.  
Objections to the release of funds of basis other than those stated above will not be considered by HUD. No objection received after September 29, 1986 will be considered by HUD.
