Bufs win first league game

The third time was the charm for the Madras White Buffaloes as they traveled to Milton-Freewater, September 19, for their first league football game of the year and came away victorious, beating the Mac Hi Pioneers 6-0.

They had faced two very tough opponents in their opening games, losing both, the first to Sweet Home 27-6, the 7th ranked AA team in the state, and the second loss was to the Crook County Cowboys, who really saddled up and poured in on shellacking the Buffs 48-8. In both of their opening games the team learned a lot that was the turning point that led them to the win over Mac Hi. The Mac Hi Pioneers now 0-3 in the season, however all their losses were close like the one they lost to the Buffs by the slimmest margin.

It was a scoreless game between the Pioneers and the Buffaloes until the midway through the final quarter where the Buffs finally got moving and pushed the ball over for the six points. It was Chris Lytle who got the call to carry and took the ball the final two yards for the score. A Beamer pass for two points after the TD failed.

With the addition of Baker and Ontario makes a big difference with more competition for all the teams in the Greater Oregon league. The next outing for the Buffs this Friday night they travel down to meet a Tri-Valley opponent Hood River. Hood River just off of a loss to The Dalles by the score of 6-0. The Blue Dragons could be on the prowl looking for the win over the Buffs. The Buffs will also be on the prowl looking for their second win for the season.

At this stage of the year it's pretty hard to determine who the powerhouse might be in the GOL league this year. Ontario seemed to have that spot in pre-season pick, but after a close game with Nyssa, changes things just a little. Baker another one that could have taken the drivers seat on the GOL was defeated by Vale, who is a powerhouse every year. They must live football in the Vale area.

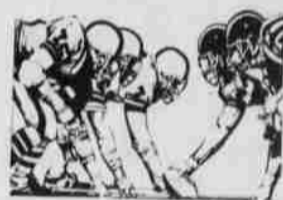

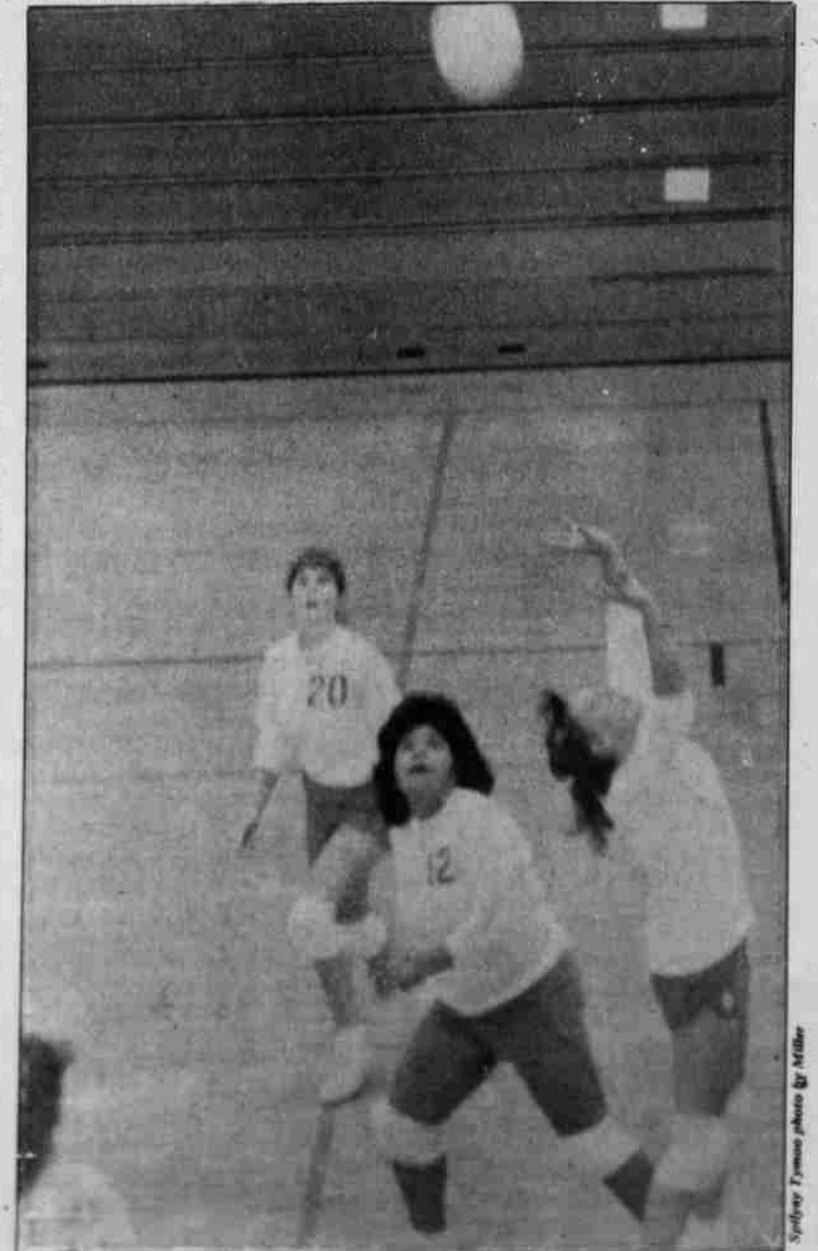
So far this season the Mt. View Cougars are the only team that has given the Buffs their biggest problem. The Cougars are a well balanced team and also have a lot of height.
