

Weed trimmers recalled

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, Black and Decker (U.S.) Inc., Towson, MD, announced a voluntary recall of approximately 647,000 of its Push Button Command Feed Weed/Grass Trimmers produced between 1981 and 1984. These trimmers are being recalled because the fan and cap assembly may fracture, throwing pieces that could injure the user or bystanders.

Black and Decker is aware of 102 reports of fan/cap breakage, some resulting in injuries involving lacerations and bruises to the feet and legs. The products were sold nationwide under the Black and Decker label, and also under the labels of Montgomery Ward and McCulloch Corporation.

Consumers are urged immediately to stop using the affected trimmers and return them to a Black and Decker Service Center listed in the yellow pages under "Tools-Electric" so that the trimmers can be repaired at no cost to the consumer.

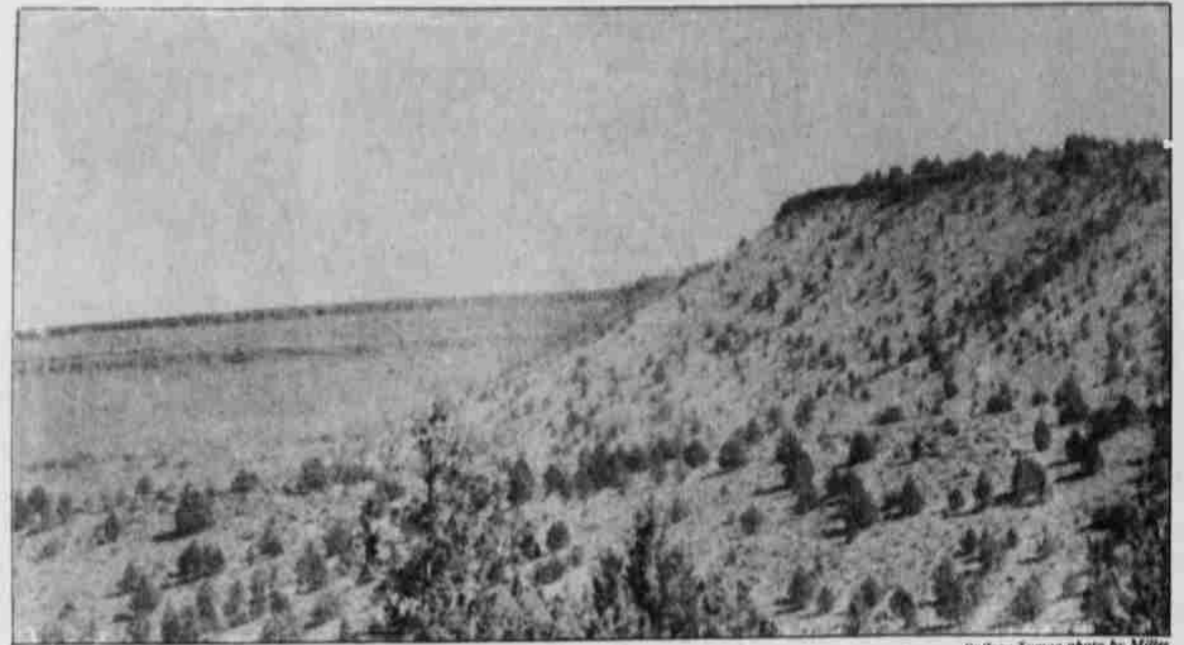

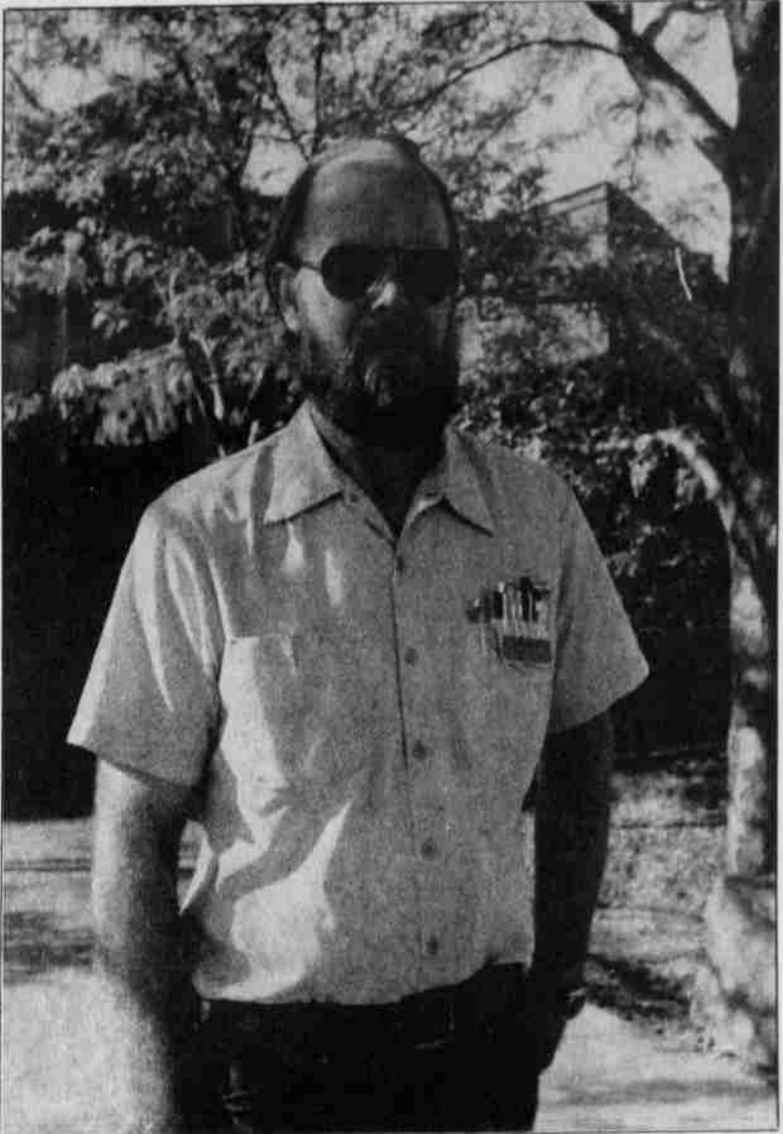

Safe disposal necessary

Bring your triple-rinsed metal containers to Round Butte Seed Growers in Culver or to Full Circle in Madras between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on October 15 and 16. At each location the cans will be crushed and collected for recycling.

Only metal agricultural chemical containers which have previously been rinsed with water at least three times will be accepted. Growers will be required to sign a statement verifying that the containers have been triple-rinsed.

This is a joint effort of the Oregon Agricultural Chemical Association, Full Circle Inc. and Round Butte Seed Growers. Inc. to help ensure future safe usage of the agricultural chemicals we need so badly. This service is provided free of charge.
