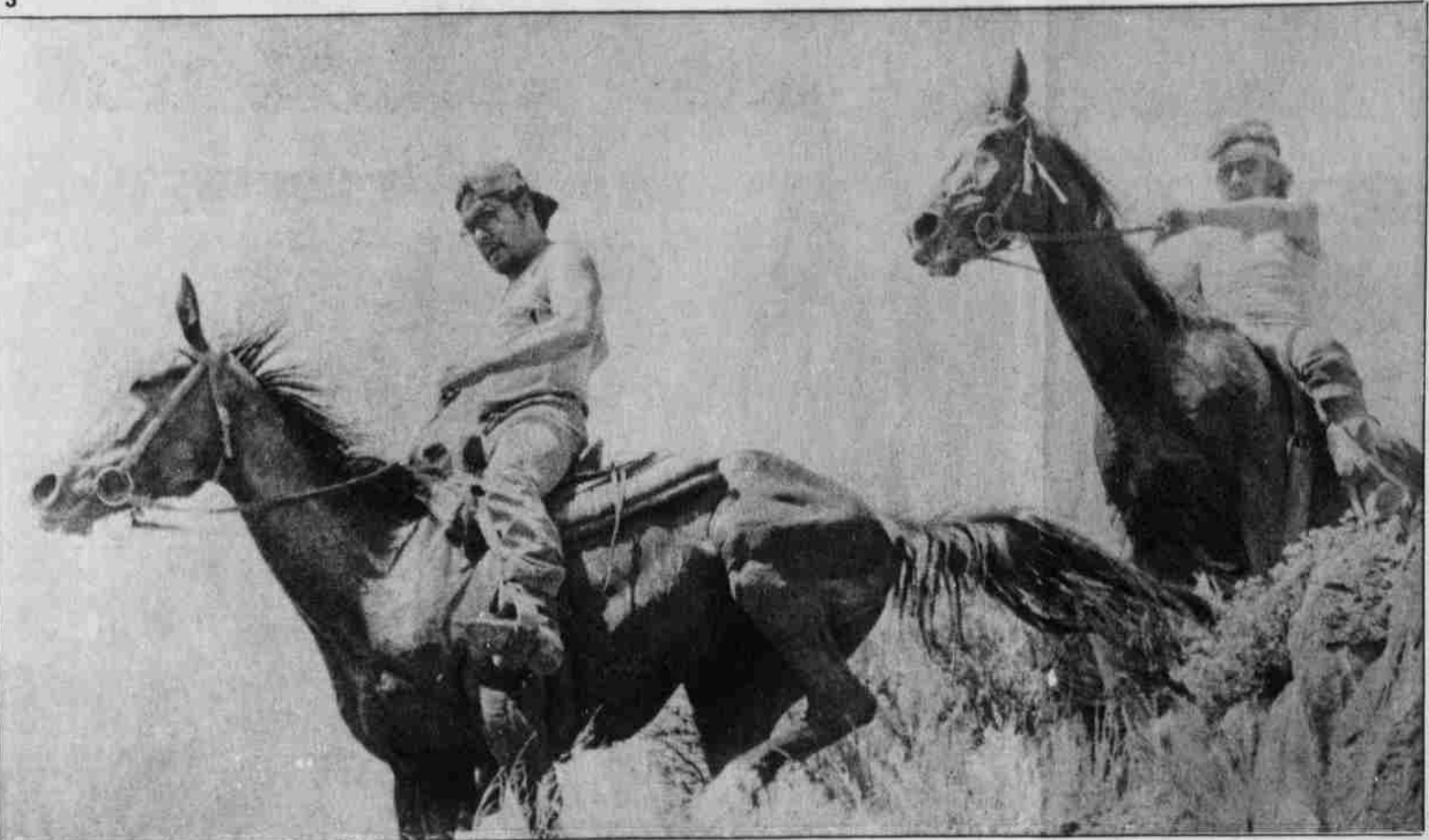

(3) Warm Springs' own FM radio station, KWSI, hit the airwaves, proving to be a great hit throughout central Oregon.

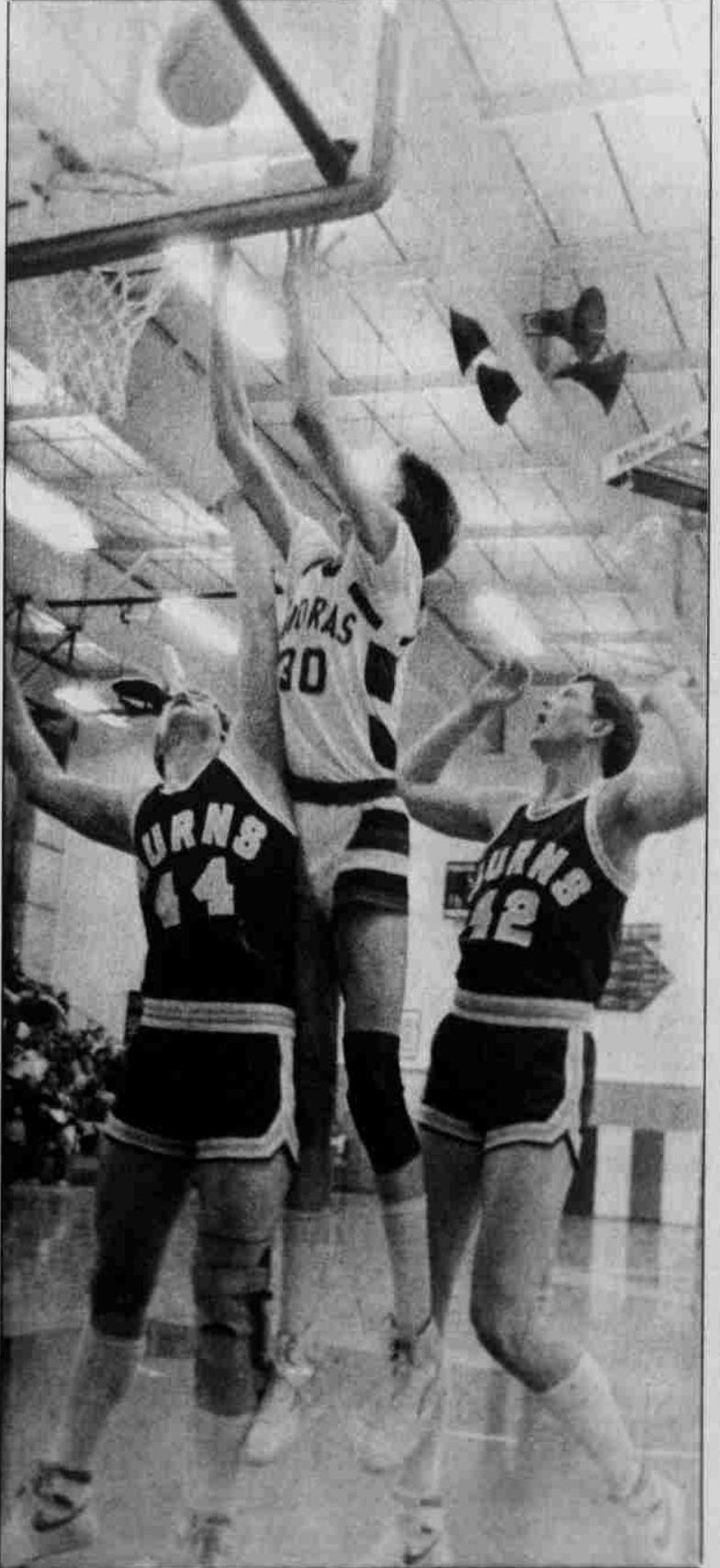
