Daily attendance, be reliable and dependable. Be able to work evenings and weekends when required. Be familiar with our Treaty and the Confederated Tribes Constitution. Must be able to communicate with elders and Indian community.

Applicant must have a valid driver's license from Oregon.

Enrolled member of the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs, Kendall Arthur, 36, died, in Portland, Oregon February 23, 1987.

Arthur was born March 24, 1950 at Warm Springs to Clifford, Sr. and Norma (Johnson) Arthur. Both parents preceded him in death. He lived on the Umatilla Indian reservation most of his life.

He is survived by his step-mother Maryann Means of Warm Springs; a brother Clifford Ricky Arthur, Jr. of Warm Springs; four sisters Vivian Arthur of Lake Tahoe, California, Helen Rubio of Port-

land, Rhonda Arthur of Warm Springs and Adeline Winishut of Portland; paternal grandmother Jessie Anderson Arthur of Warm Springs and numerous cousins, nieces and nephews.

Dressing ceremonies were held February 24 at the Warm Springs Agency Longhouse with Wilson Wewa, Jr officiating. The body was taken February 24 to the Mission Longhouse on the Umatilla Indian Reservation where overnight Washut services were held. Burial followed at the Homly Cemetery February 25.

## Roberto Tapia Torrez

Warm Springs resident, Roberto Tapia Torrez, 56, died at St. Charles Medical Center in Bend, Oregon on February 17, 1987 following a lengthy illness.

Torrez was born June 7, 1930 in Mexico. On September 10, 1960 he married Ruby Reed in Reno, Nevada. The couple made their home in San Francisco, California and then moved to Portland, Oregon. Eight years ago the couple moved to Warm Springs. He had worked as a crane operator in heavy construction.
