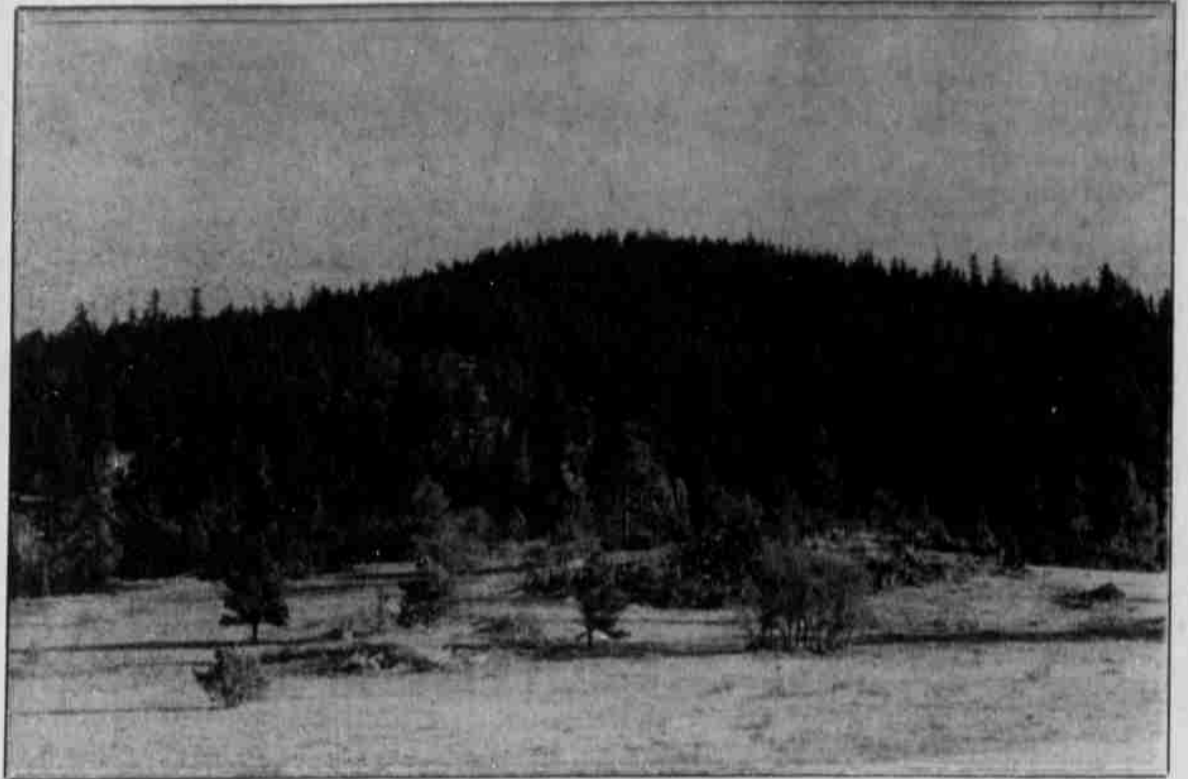
ing Glory Balloon Co. from Redmond, Oregon and a real special "thank you" to the Bonanza 88 store in Madras for a generous contribution of toys.

milestone and accomplishment is a major step for the tribe's judicial system and they 'they's.' Opportunity and courage needed to be present and executed in order that cases such as these prevail. The opportunity was there and everyone, especially the victims and the jury had the courage to do something about it, and they did."

Smith concluded by saying, "More than anything else we cannot turn back time or take back the harm these children experienced. No one can ever do that, not the court or

even the perpetrator by admitting to or being found guilty of these acts. We can, however, point out that the system does work and there is help available to victims who report such activities to the authorities.

"We, as a community, all suffer when such activities go unheeded. On Friday, March 20, the 'theys' made a goalline stand. It took a lot of courage to see this case to a prosecutive end, but they have done something and prevailed."
