

Chapter I-M program meets needs

The Chapter I-M Program in Jefferson County is now completing its seventh year. Several years ago, the lawmakers of our nation began to realize that the children of our agricultural and fishery workers often have special educational needs.

In many cases, the families often move in order to find work, and so the children have to keep changing schools throughout the year. Because of the many interruptions in their regular school activities, the children sometimes fall behind in their studies and even lose interest. To help correct this problem, in 1966 the U.S. Congress passed a law establishing special educational programs and services designed to provide extra help for migrant school children.

The Jefferson County School District 509-J applies for Federal monies through the State Department of Education and the Migrant Education Service Center in Salem, Oregon on a yearly basis. Summer school funds are also applied for separately.

An eligible child is one who has moved across state or school district lines with a parent or guardian

who is seeking temporary or seasonal work in agriculture, fishing, or related activities including food processing and the harvesting and cultivation of trees. This is determined by a home visit made by the Home/school consultant. Eligibility is then established and registered on a Certificate of Eligibility which then generates MSRTS enrollment. The period of eligibility then lasts for a total of six (6) years. The first year as a 'current migrant student' and the last five as a 'former migrant student', unless there is another move.

Special teachers and aides work with eligible children individually or in small groups to give them the extra education in basic skills such as reading, oral language, math, language arts, or in any other problem area. The Resource Teacher monitors these activities.

In order to do well in school, a child must be in good health. Migrant Education, in cooperation with other community agencies, tries to make sure that every child is provided with needed health care. Eligible children are also provided with a 24-hour/7 day a week accident

insurance policy during they stay in the State of Oregon. The Home/school consultant handles these claims.

The Migrant Student record transfer system (MSRTS) is a nationwide computerized communications network designed to transfer the health and educational and health information on identified eligible students throughout the country. These records are part of the responsibility of the home/school consultant. This system was set up in 1969 and carries information on more than 800,000 migrant students. Locally, we have 510 eligible students in the Tri-County area.

Technical assistance regarding Recruitment, Identification, Parent Involvement, record-keeping, etc., is provided to schools in the area outside the Jefferson County and the Culver attendance area by the home/school consultant. Other types of support services are also provided such as translations, attendance follow-ups, transportation, home visits, etc., by the home/school consultant.

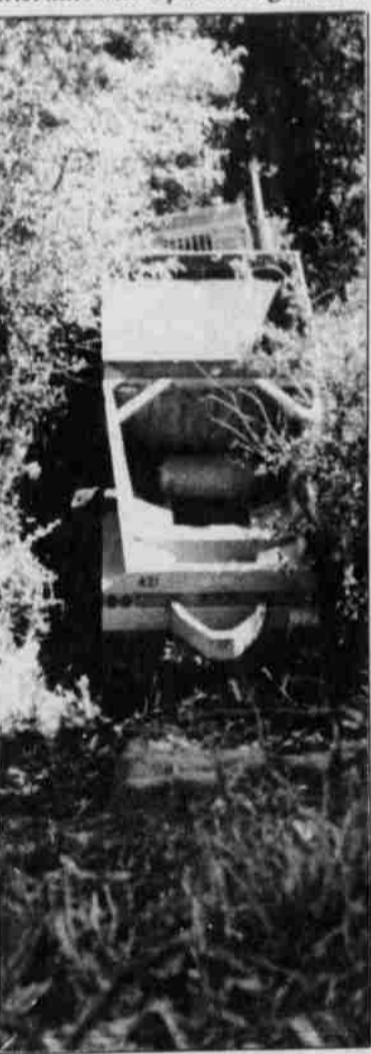

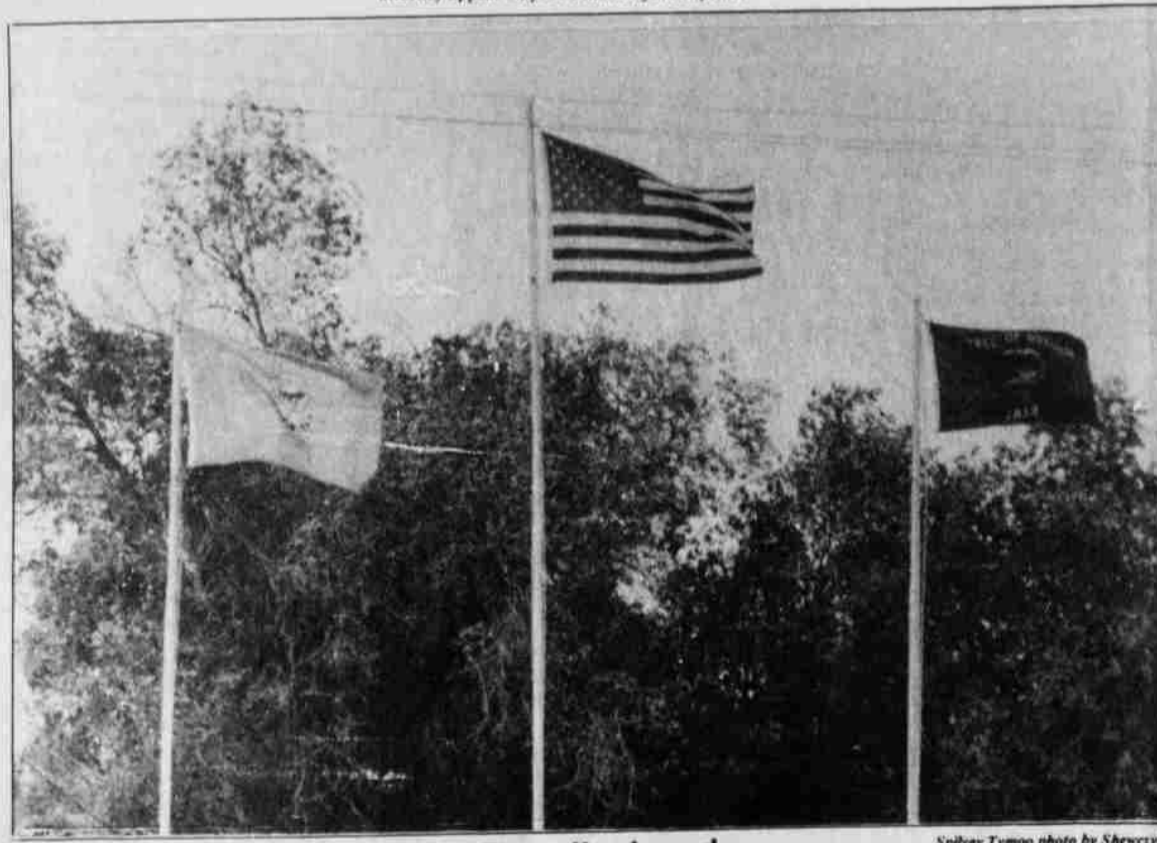

Early Childhood Ed. sets pre-registration June 10, 18

Pre-registration for Headstart and/or Tribal Preschool three year olds will begin June 10, 1987. Children must be three years old on or before September 1, 1987 in

order to register their child (ren) in the Head Start and/or Tribal Preschool program. For those parents who plan to enroll their child, please mark your calendars with the following dates:

June 10, 1987, urinalysis and hemococrits tests will be given between 8:30 a.m.-1:00 p.m. at the Head Start 3's Room, at the Community Center.

June 18, 1987, physical examinations and pre-registration will take place between 8:30 a.m.-1:00 p.m. at the Head Start 3's room, at the Community Center. It is very important that you and your child attend both days-June 10 and 18, since I.H.S. is working cooperatively with the Early Childhood Education program to prepare these young children for the 1987-88 school year.

When pre-registering your child, we ask that you bring the following information with you on June 18: Proof of income—it can be your paycheck stub from the paycheck you receive the 10th of each month, verification from your employer of your correct salary, W-2 form, social security-a copy of the social security check will be required; social security numbers of all adults living in your household; two emergency contact numbers. If there are any questions, please contact the Head Start office, 553-1161, ext. 241 or 242.

On June 8, 1987, our young children will be transferring in our Head Start/Day Care trailers. Our present three-year-olds will be transferring to Kay Anstett's four-year-old room, the four-year-olds will be transferring to the Child Development Kindergarten room, and the Child Development Strider's will be transferring to Vivian Wewa's three-year-old room. It has been a very good year for all of those children and teachers and we will miss those children who are going into Kindergarten.

The 1986-87 school year in our Early Childhood programs has gone by fast, and our children's last day in our Head Start Part Day and Tribal Preschool programs will be June 5. For all those four-year-olds who will be entering Kindergarten next year, we wish them the very best because they have been delightful children. And we look forward to those children who will be coming into Head Start and our Tribal Preschool programs next year.
