Finance changes accounts payable policies, procedures

for Travel Advance: There is now available for all departments a combined Travel Authorization/Check Request. These forms can be requested from the Printing department. Everything is all on one

Accounts Payable-Procedures form. Even the reimbursement for any expenses over the Travel Advance. It is on the back of the same Travel Authorization. If you go over the amount advanced to you for travel you can turn in your receipts along with the back of the goldenrod copy of the travel autho-

approved for reimbursement. You do not have to get it approved It is important to save all your

receipts, to verify that you went over the advanced amount. When you are ready to go on a trip for a conference or for training, you must submit the combined form along with a copy of the agenda or brochure as a back-up. Be sure and get your back-up in with your request to prevent any delays in processing your checks. If there is no agenda or brochures available and arrangements were made by phone, this has to be verified by your supervisor in writing.

3.1 Priority use

The Vehicle Pool Manager may assign vehicles for program use based on related need. Appeals may be made to the Enterprise Manager, whose decision will be final.

3.2 Special vehicles, licenses, permits

(a) A chauffeur's license is required drivers who transport persons as a public service, other than tribal employees.

(b) Tribal police and Fire and Safety have their own requirements which are included, as follows:

State Driver's License; 2. Have orientation on vehicle; 3. Emergency driving procedures. 4. (Police only) Within six (6) months of appointment must complete the Emergency Vehicle Operation

(c) Only trained drivers, approved by the Vehicle Pool Manager may operate vehicles having four-wheel drive, air brakes, two speed rearends, or any other special equip-

(d) Vehicles from the 34 ton fourwheel drive series to the larger die-

sel trucks and buses will have spe-Fire Safety and Police: I. Oregon cific drivers assigned to them. Each new driver will undergo operation instructions and test driving by the Vehicle pool Manager prior to operating such vehicles.

(e) Designated drivers of buses, mini-buses, vans and any vehicle used to transport children, elderly, or groups must have had prior Firstaid training and defensive driving training in addition to the required chauffeur's license

(d) Any person who causes injuries or harm to other persons or damages property as a result of misuse or abuse of tribal vehicles

from his or her tribal employment, 4.1 Accidents

(a) All accidents must be reported. The proper and necessary reporting forms can be obtained from the Police department or Insurance Program. All applicable state and local laws will be observed.

shall be immediately terminated

4.0 Misuse and abuse

(a) Any person misusing or abuse tribal vehicles may lose their driving privileges and will be held personally responsible for any resulting damages to the vehicle(s) up to \$250. A warning will be issued by the Safety Board notifying the driver of possible job loss if further violations occur. A second violation of this type will result in immediate termination of the employee's job and assessment of up to \$250 for damages.

(b) The Vehicle Pool Manager has the responsibility to park, secure and lock any tribal vehicle that is being misused or abused and to report such infractions to the violator's immediate supervisor and branch manager.

(c) When operating a tribal vehicle, any person found guilty of reckless driving, willful misconduct, or driving under the influence of drugs or alcohol, shall have their driving privileges immediately suspended for one year and may be terminated from tribal employment. depending upon the seriousness of the violation.
