Enrolled member of the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs, Eugene Bishop Frank, 50, died September 2, 1987.

A lifelong resident of Warm Springs, he was born December 22, 1936 in Warm Springs to Amos Reed and Marena Frank. He attended schools in Warm Springs and Madras. He attended Tacoma Vocational Technical School where he became a diesel mechanic.

On April 18, 1970 he married Shirley Watah in Reno, Nevada. She preceded him in death September 9, 1982. At the time of his death he was self-employed as a heavy equipment operator and mechanic. His family described him as "a simple man who stayed behind the scene"

and "friendly person who made people happy.

He is survived by two sons, Timothy Smith and Jamie Smith; one daughter, Stephanie Frank, his mother, Marena Miller; four sisters, Marilyn Wagner, Ramona Tanewasha, Doris Miller and Norma Miller; three grandchildren and numerous nieces and nephews.

Dressing ceremonies were held Sunday, September 6, 1987 at the Agency Longhouse with Nelson Wallulatum and Larry Dick officiating. Wilson Wewa, Jr. and Delvis Heath conducted Seven Drum overnight ceremonies at the Longhouse. Burial was Monday, September 7 at the Dry Creek Cemetery with Reverend Allen Elston officiating.
