Accounting News

Did you know that payroll and payroll connected costs make up 75 percent of the annual tribal budget. The latest information received by the IRS and Oregon taxing agencies for payroll taxes are as follows: Social Security (FICA) .0715 on

first, \$43,800 of salary. State Unemp. Ins. (SUI) .034 on first, \$14,000 of salary. Federal Unemp. ins. (FUI) .008 on first, 7,000 of salary. State Indus. Acc. (SIAC), \$35.

The above taxes cost the Tribes a range of eight percent of annual salary for the highest paid employee to 12 percent of annual salary for the lowest paid employee. The above costs are charged to your program because they are a fixed chargeable amount.

The following payroll connected costs fluctuate from year to year and actual costs are not known until future dates, therefore, begin-

ning in 1987, they were no longer charged to your program: Workers' Compensation

Insurance. Premiums vary (based on risk of getting on the job injur-ies) from \$.40/\$100 of annual salary to \$11/\$100 of annual salary.

Group Insurance—Medical, with dependents, \$1,914; without dependents, \$696.

Life-Group 1-9 (see salary table) .01128 x salary, Group 1-15, .00564

Disability (5 or more years of service)—Group 1-3, \$234, Group 4-6, \$187, Group 7-10, \$140 and Group 11-15, \$94. Pension: If employee has a full

year's service as of January 1: .038 x salary. Christmas: Employees on pay-

roll as of 12/25, \$25.

These costs range from 10-16 percent of annual salary.


An enrolled member of the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs, Margaret Lorraine Still, was killed in Live Oak, California December
