Steve Nelson from the Northwest Educational Regional Laboratory was in the district on Monday, February 8 and Tuesday, February 9, talking to counselors, teacher assistants, and teachers funded by Title IV. He reported very positively on the work he observed and encouraged the Title IV counselors to continue their regular monthly meetings designed to communicate with each other on their work in their individual schools.

Reports were given on several workshops attended by committee members, and there is a possibility of an exchange again this year by students at Cal Young Middle School in Eugene with students at Madras Junior High.

Student store

The students who live in Sidwaller, Wolfe Point, Kah-Nee-Ta and Simdnasho wait on the playground until 4:00 p.m. each day to ride the bus home. This means that students do not arrive home until long after their stomachs growl for nourishment. In response to a suggestion from Debbie Smith, parent and JOM chairperson, Dawn Smith, counselor and Vicki Moore, fourth grade teacher, have created a student store to make that waiting time more pleasant for the children and to help fill that hole in their stomach until they reach home. Students help these teachers sell snack items to the children. The snack items are purchased at Macy's store and sold to the children at a minimal cost. The selection of the snacks is carefully monitored by the Warm Springs Elementary Wellness team, i.e., Vicki and Dawn.

Woodstove safety campaign

During the month of January Warm Springs Elementary had a "woodstove safety campaign." Classrooms studied the risks involved with woodstoves and then partici-

pated in a poster contest. Students submitted posters which illustrated a variety of measures to promote the safe use of wood stoves to the building safety committee. All participating students received a baseball cap with the inscription, "stars for safety." Caps were provided by Wayne Potter and Dean Seyler, WS Fire and Safety chief. Following lunch, the winners walked to the Fire and Safety department to learn about the fire trucks and equipment from Danny Martinez. Danny loaded all the children on top of a fire truck for the ride back to school.

Constitutional Celebration

On Thursday, February 11, Liz Tewee, Margie Earl, Evaline Patt, Aurolyn Stwyer, and Irene Wells gave presentations which culminated the students' week of study on the 50th Anniversary of the Tribal Constitution. The students were shown the video, "Warm Springs Today," and participated in discussions about the history of education on the reservation, the structure and functions of the tribal government, tribal enterprises and tribal customs and traditions.
