carry any firearms, use no alcohol, drugs or narcotics, submit to searches of his person, home or vehicle and that he not travel to the Warm Springs Indian reservation.

Evidence was presented to the federal grand jury in Portland on August 9 and McSweeney was indicted on two counts: distributing cocaine and possessing cocaine with the intent to distribute it. He will be arraigned August 25, 1988 at which time he will enter a plea. A trial date will be set at that time.

Moran stated the use of the Law and Order Code, Chapter 300, leads to the exclusion of persons not legally entitled to reside on the reservation. The ordinance also allows the removal of any person who is a non-member or non-resident, who acts in disregard to tribal ordinances, state laws and federal laws and who engages in acts and conduct which can cause financial, health, psychological and social problems for tribal members. Technically the Treaty of 1855 gave the tribes the right to keep non-members and non-residents off reservation lands.

The tribes have the right to quickly and effectively remove people who create problems and an example has been the people who traffic in illegal drugs and contraband thus causing problems. It was the decision of Tribal Council to enforce the exclusion law to remove people.

Other people excluded from the reservation have been Kah-Nee-Ta employees: I. Melvin Victor McGill, 45, an enrolled Poma Indian who was arrested for possession of methamphetamine, he was cited into

Tribal Court and his trial is pending; 2. Robert Eugene Newberry, 32, former head chef at the lodge, was arrested for possession of methamphetamine on July 11. He was arrested on a warrant from Jefferson County and at that time was also excluded; 3. Chris Duane Thomas, 19, Madras, arrested for the possession of marijuana and excluded during July; 4. Lannie Robert Hogge, 24, Madras, arrested July 11 and excluded. He was charged with possessing marijuana and narcotic paraphernalia. He was a resident of the hamlet at the time of arrest; 5. Edna Temoke, a Nevada Indian, was arrested for possession of marijuana and was excluded July 15, 1988. Three people who registered as guests at the resort were charged and escorted from the reservation. Those being: 1. David Lawrence Beck, 5790 Harvest Lane, Redmond, for possession of marijuana and paraphernalia with criminal charges pending in Wasco County; 2. David Lee Runyon, 23, 8745 Southwest Marine Terrace, Portland, cited into Wasco County, released and escorted from the reservation and 3. William James AumMallen, 25, 9715 Southwest Englewood Court, Portland, charged with less than one ounce of marijuana, cited in Wasco County, released and escorted off the reservation.

People who continue to create problems on the reservation who are non-members or non-residents will be excluded from within the borders of the reservation, according to Moran. Charges will be made with the necessary agencies.

That house on Warm Springs Street, you know, the one that badly needed a fresh coat of paint, in one week's time, got just what the doctor ordered—thanks to eight ten Community Service Workers. The Workers sand blasted the exterior, applied primer and finished the job with a fresh coat of gleaming white paint and bright blue trim. The crew also spent time

cleaning up the yard, trimmed bushes, cleaned out the basement and moved the new occupants, the Parole and Probation Office, into the building.

The Community Service Worker caseload currently consists of 43 adults and eight juveniles. Coordinator for the program is Corinna Sohappya.

assault in the second degree, driving under the influence, reckless driving, and attempting to elude a police officer. Charges are a result of a July 24 incident in Jefferson County.

Madras city police officer Robert Dahl reported that on July 24 he observed the Wallulatum car being driven in an erratic manner, he attempted to stop the car but the car headed out of the city limits at a high rate of speed turning on Belmont Lane and then on to the Pelton Dam Road with Dahl in pursuit. Dahl reported that the Wallulatum car failed to negotiate a turn and then careened down a

100 foot embankment, coming to rest on its top.

A passenger, Nancy Smith Zamora, 34, Warm Springs was seriously injured. She was transported from the accident scene by Air Life to St. Charles Medical Center where she underwent surgery. Zamora is presently in the Madras Nursing Home undergoing therapy.

Wallulatum was arraigned in District Court on August 10 to hear the charges read and to enter a plea. He entered a not guilty plea. A trial date has not yet been set at press time.
