Anyone who has had to pay a long-distance charge to call Social Security can now call without cost by using the toll-free number 1-800-2345-USA (1-800-234-5772). In addition, the hours people can call have been extended.

With the new toll-free number, anyone can call 24 hours a day. Calls between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. each business day will be answered by a live operator, and, at other times, a caller can leave a message which will be answered the next business day, or at a time convenient for the caller.

Young said that callers should find SSA's new toll-free telephone service especially convenient when they need to change a mailin-


