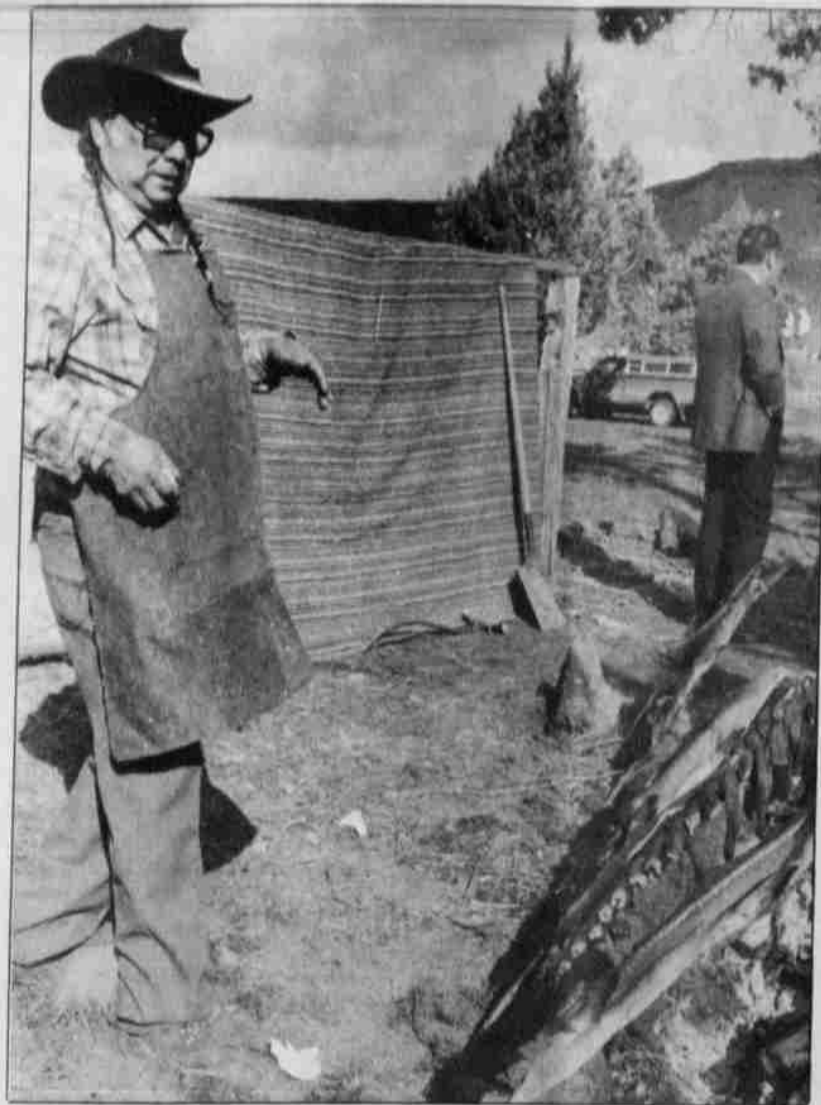

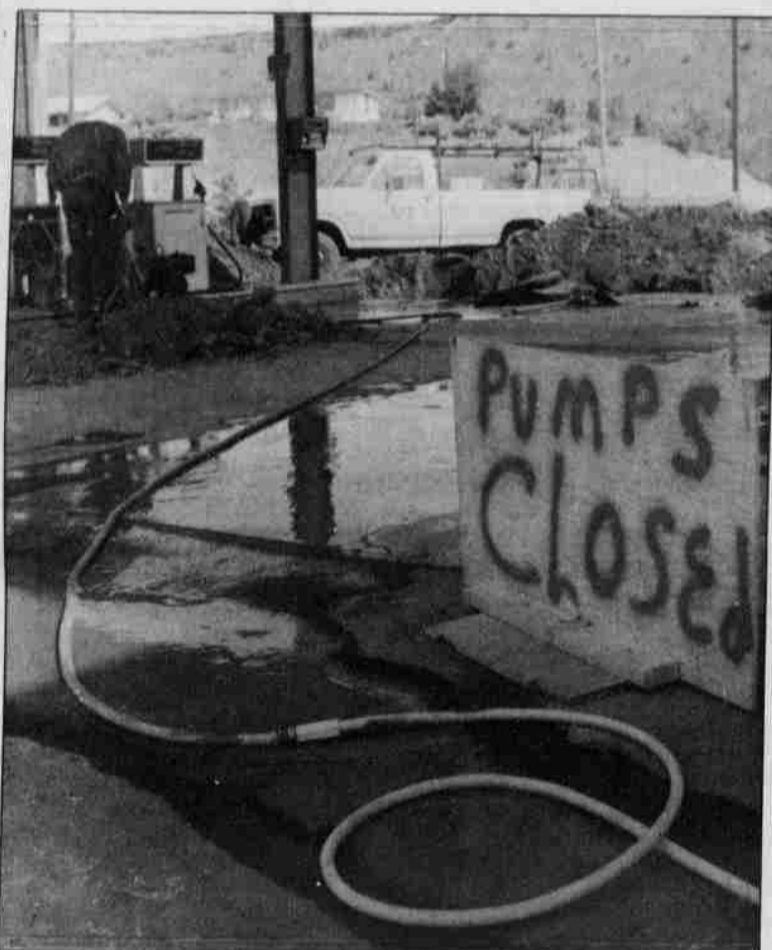


Salmon and eels were on the menu for the 50th Anniversary celebration of the Tribes self-determination.

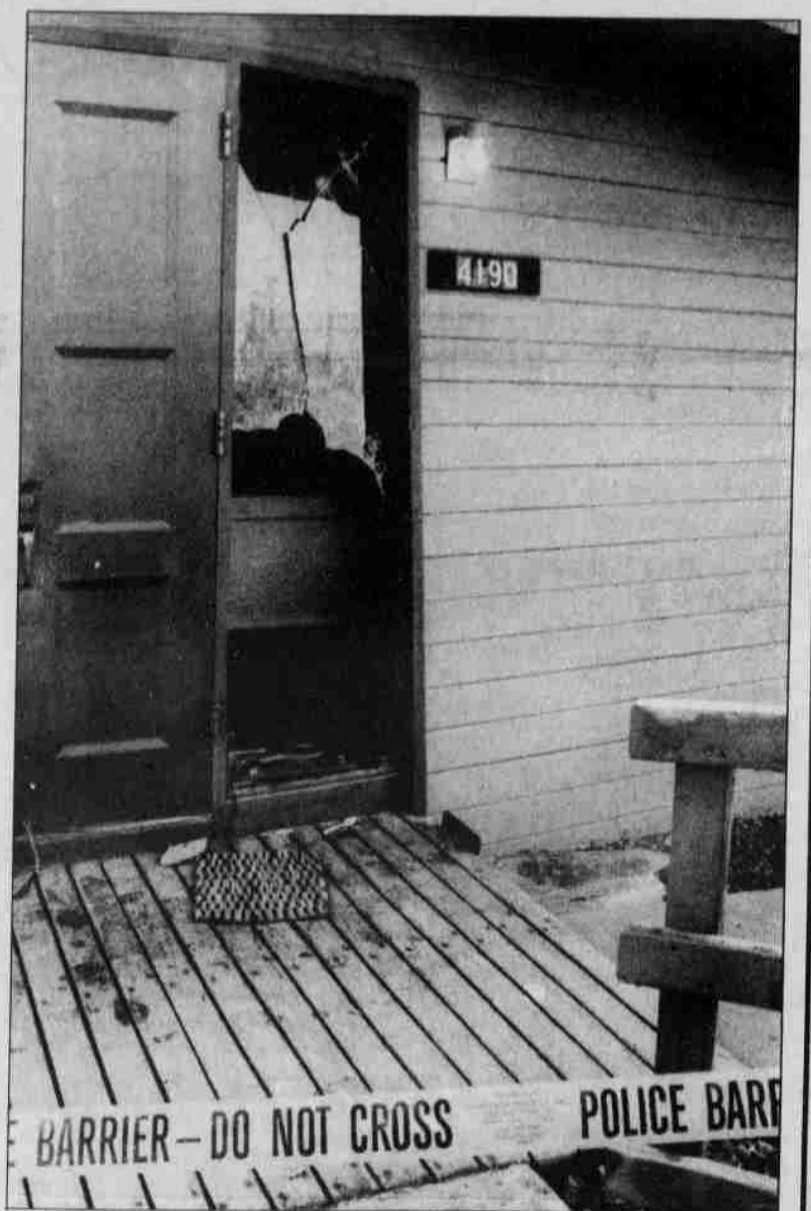
The gas leak caused the closure of the garage and Community Center.
