ranging for Pacific Power to provide interim financial support associated with state and federal grants and loans to finance improvements to Madras' industrial park and airport.

"Pacific has a very strong commitment to supporting economic development in the communities it serves," Quinn said. "Combining that with the kind of organized, aggressive economic development groups that Madras and the county have, I see great things happening here in the future."

Of his new job, Quinn said, "Managing the Hood River conservation demonstration project was really exciting, and this new position gives me an opportunity

to get back into that kind of a job."

The Hood River project involved total weatherization and other energy-efficiency measures for homes in Hood River County. A joint project of Pacific Power, BPA, and the Natural Resources Defense Council, it was designed to give utility planners a precise measurement of the impact of conservation on the energy requirements and needs of a community.

"The company is conducting an internal review of candidates to replace Quinn, and we hope to name his replacement in the next few weeks," commented Mike Rippet, division manager for Pacific Power in Bend. "We're looking for someone with the same kind of commitment to the community that Quinn showed."

Run set for February 11

The Warm Springs Reservation Runners is sponsoring their second of 12 runs on February 11, 1989 at Simnasho, Oregon beginning at 10:00 a.m. Entries will be taken from 9:00-9:45 a.m. at the Simnasho fire hall by Val Squiemphen and Francelia Miller.

Courses are two and four miles, out and back, with a water station at the one-mile mark. Cost is \$5 per couple or \$3 per individual. Couples must be entered in the same race. When registering, please park in the Longhouse parking lot to avoid congestion at the entrance of the fire hall.

A third run is scheduled for March 25 at Kah-Nee-Ta. There

will be a three-mile run and a 10K-run. No other information is available on that run, but the date is final. Put that down on your calendar.
