## Children's Festival set for July 29

Drake Park will be the center of activities for the Cascade Children's Festival 89, on Saturday July 29 from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. First time ever will be a parade of mascots, including each and every high school mascot, plus local business and service mascots for a "Bakers Dozen" of mascots. Adding to the fun will be a dunk tank featuring prominent "Dunkees" known for their community spirit. Other activities will be clowns, puppets, storytellers, fiddlers, train rides and booths with every imaginable children's kind of fun from face painting to a petting zoo.

## Registration nears

It's registration time! Time to get your child ready for the Head Start Program. If your child will be three or four years old ON OR BEFORE September 1, 1989, she/he is eligible to enroll in one of our two programs: Head Start or Tribal Preschool.

Head Start is located at the community center. There will be one class of three year olds. Daily sessions of Head Start three. There are two four year old daily classes. Our Head Start program hours for the children are 8:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. with breakfast and lunch served daily.

Tribal Preschool is located at the Presbyterian Church. The program is available for Tribal member children ages three and four years old. There will be one three year old daily afternoon session of Tribal Preschool and two four year old daily morning sessions as Tribal Preschool. Hours for Tribal Preschool children is 8:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. with a snack ONLY being served daily.

Please come by the Head Start office today to pick up your child's registration packet. Required information you will need to complete the registration packet: proof of income, paycheck stub from the 10th of the month (no draw check stubs), W-2 form, Social Security-a copy of your check or written proof of amount you receive from the Social Security Administration, Public Assistance (Welfare, Food

Stamps, etc.)-a copy of your statement of amount you receive; social security numbers of all adults, 21 years of age or older living in the same household and two (2) emergency contacts.

A physical examination and immunization is required an appointment is needed at the I.H.S. Clinic if this is your child's first year in the Head Start/Tribal Preschool programs. Physical examinations and immunization forms may be picked up at the Head Start office before your child's visit to the clinic.

The Early Childhood Education Programs (Head Start, Head Start/Day Care, Latch-Key and Tribal Preschool) utilizes the Child Care Food Program which is a federal program of the Food and Nutrition Service, United States Department of Agriculture. It is operated in accordance with the U.S.D.A. policy, which does not permit discrimination because of race, color, national origin, handicap, age, religion or sex in the meal service, admissions policy or use of any Child Care Food Program facility. Any person who believes that he or she has been discriminated against any U.S.D.A. related activity should write immediately to the Secretary of Agriculture, Washington, D.C. 20250.

## Howlak Tichum Orin Johnson

(Information provided by family)

Orin Johnson was born September 20, 1905 in Seeksequa where he lived until his death on July 6, 1989. He was 83 years of age. He was born to Mark and Sally Johnson who preceded him in death.

Orin attended school at Chemawa Indian School in Salem, Oregon where he excelled in academics and in all sports, mainly baseball and boxing. Orin maintained his athletic skills after earning the name of McGee by which he was known to the baseball world where he was a short stop. To the world of boxing, he made quite a name for himself by becoming a Golden Glove Champion and then he turned professional.

Orin met and married Pauline Warren and together they raised Cordelia Kneeland. They were married over 60 years.

In 1954, upon the death of John Allen Sr., Orin and Pauline Johnson legally adopted Pauline, John, Patricia Allen and Cheryl Kennedy.

Orin knew the importance of education and he stressed this vital need of schooling to his children. He sent his children to Madras, Oregon schools, where they graduated from High School and then for some, on to college.

Orin's occupations throughout his life time were many. Farmer, rancher, forest ranger and guide, ship-yard welder in Portland, Oregon's Swan Island, carpenter's helper and then carpenter, Round Butte Dam construction worker, custodian at the Warm Springs community center. Orin then retired from working at a job and went into the Full Gospel ministry on a full time basis.

Orin served on the Tribal Council approximately 20 years. His first term in office began in May of 1941. His last term was in April 1977. Orin represented the Seeksequa District serving his people and all the Tribe in an honest and truthful manner. He was a member of the Culture and Heritage Committee until the time of his death. Orin had also served on various other committees during his life time.

Orin was brought into the Full Gospel ministry in Prineville, Oregon in 1956 by his wife Pauline who had taken the children there for church a couple of years earlier. Orin's family were members of the Melrose Full Gospel Church pastored by Reverend Irvin Stewart where Orin, too, upon his salvation, became a member.

Orin and Pauline talked to many people about God and converted many people in Warm Springs to

the Lord Jesus Christ. There were so many newly formed converts that they too, took their families and attended church meetings in Prineville, Oregon.

With the number of people that had joined the Full Gospel Church, there was a need to establish a meeting place in Warm Springs because a lot of people could not travel to Prineville regularly, so Orin's family started going from home to home to worship.

In 1957, the need was evident due to the many families that were now attending to establish a permanent meeting place.

The first Full Gospel Church was in what is now the Inter-Tribal Sports Store established in 1957. The first pastor was Reverend Waldo Boileau.

Several locations later, the church and its membership arrived at the present location and is known as the Warm Springs Full Gospel Church.

Orin had been in the Full Gospel ministry for 30 years, in which a number of his members have come and gone before him.

Orin had traveled to many states taking the gospel of Jesus Christ. He had preached in Idaho, California, Nevada, Montana, South Dakota, Arizona and throughout Oregon. He preached in Indian as well as non-Indian communities.

Orin is survived by his wife Pauline Warren Johnson, four children, Pauline, John, Pat Allen and Cheryl Kennedy, Grandchildren, Leroy Allen, Sr., Deborah Allen Scott, Stanford Orin Kneeland, Cecile and Tim Kneeland, Great grand children, Roman and Jolie Suppah, Desiree, Marcel, Reynolds and Leroy Allen, Jr., Tamara Kennedy, Kim Scott Tenorio, Israel, Shelby and Sissy Scott, Kayla and Brittany Kneeland, Great-great grandchildren, Fallon, Lydell, Della Ray and Mandy Suppah, Jarod and Jace Allen, Cari Ann and Jessie Tenorio.

One niece, Karen Wallulatum, one nephew, Delford Johnson, great nephews, Lee and Raymond Johnson, Jr., Darrell, Owen, Ralph, Warren and Merris Wallulatum, Jr. and Mark Johnson also survive.

Also surviving are great nieces Doreen and Carrie Johnson, Myra Johnson Shawaway, Carla and Kathleen Wallulatum, Rosa Wallulatum Graybael, Joni Wallulatum Bailey, Reva, Radine, and Jolene Johnson.

There are several great, great nephews and nieces and many other relatives who, along with the family, who will miss Grandpa Orin.

## Probationary permits allow for some privileges

How to get a hardship or probationary driving permit

If your license is suspended you may apply to DMV for a hardship permit which grants you some driving privileges. You must show to the division that you need to drive:

- as a part of your employment,
- to get to and from work,
- to get to and from an alcohol

treatment or rehabilitation program, or

- to get medical treatment.

If the sole reason for your license suspension is an uninsured accident you may get a hardship permit to meet basic family needs like taking children to and from school, caring for elderly family members and grocery shopping.

If you are convicted by a judge of driving under the influence, reckless driving or attempting to elude the police, you will need the judge to recommend to the division that you be given a hardship permit.

If your license is revoked because you are found to be a habitual traffic offender you may apply to the division for a probationary permit. If your driving privileges are revoked for any other reason you will not be eligible for a probationary permit. A habitual traffic offender

is one who has been convicted of either three major traffic offenses or 20 (or more) minor traffic violations within a five year period.

A probationary permit is similar to a hardship permit but harder to obtain. To get this permit you must show the division that you need to drive for:

- occupational or employment purposes,
- occupational training or education that is required by your employer,
- transportation to and from an alcohol treatment program, or
- an employment search.

These are the only purposes for which the division will issue a probationary permit.

Note that DMV can require documentation or verification for the reasons you offer for a hardship or probationary permit. The

division has wide discretion in granting or denying applications and in setting conditions for permits. With either the hardship or probationary permit, the division can limit your driving privileges as it sees fit. Hardship permits often set out when and where you may drive, including days, hours and routes. If you violate the permit's conditions, you will be charged with driving with a suspended or revoked license.

The cost for either permit is \$82.00. There is an additional \$10 annual renewal fee for the probationary permit.

Set out above are some of the basics. There are many details of the law that are too numerous to list in this article. If you have a specific problem, don't rely on this article but contact an attorney.
