Their unique judicial system is based on traditional use and custom and legislation and treaties that date back to 1854. How does this affect today's system? In "Iribal Law and You", Don Costello, chief judge of the Confederated Tribes, will examine sources of tribal law and current court procedure and pro-CCSS. The class will examine personal rights and learn how to work within the tribal judicial system to seek remedies for redress and work out win-win solutions with offenders. Topics will include practical and philosophical issues.
