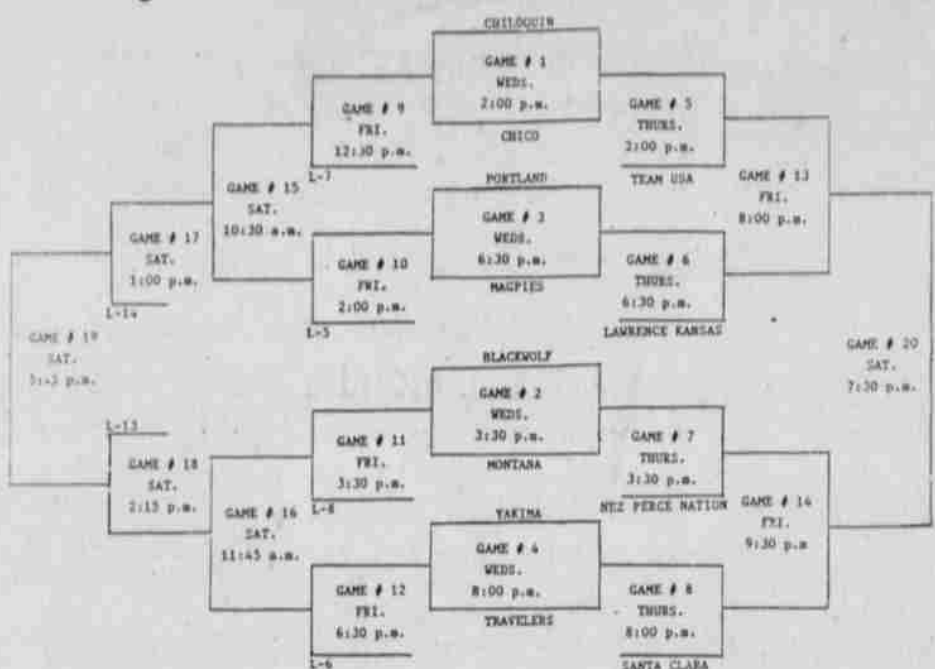


Holiday Basketball Tournament bracket

Director needed for Cornell American Indian Program

The American Indian Program at Cornell University is attempting to fill a full-time tenure track position for a new director. The position is scheduled to be filled by July 1990.

Cornell's American Indian Program is a multidisciplinary, intercollegiate program consisting of five components: teaching, research, student support, extension, and publications. Its goals include de-

veloping respect for and understanding of native world views by enabling faculty to conduct research and offer courses with Indian content, enabling Indian students to achieve a Cornell education, extending Cornell resources to Indian communities, creating forums to train educators about Indian issues, and recruiting American Indian students and faculty members. The program's instructional core offers

courses focusing on American Indian life with an emphasis on Iroquois and Indians of the Northeast. Through research and extension, the program assists Indian communities in addressing issues ranging from bilingual education and curriculum development to economic development alternatives and environmental rehabilitation. Maintaining strong working relationships with other academic departments at Cornell and with a statewide Indian advisory committee is essential.

Applicants must have a Ph.D.

(or professional equivalent) and sufficient academic experience and credentials for academic appointment at the associate or full professor level.

The salary is competitive, and commensurate with background and experience. Attractive fringe benefits are available.

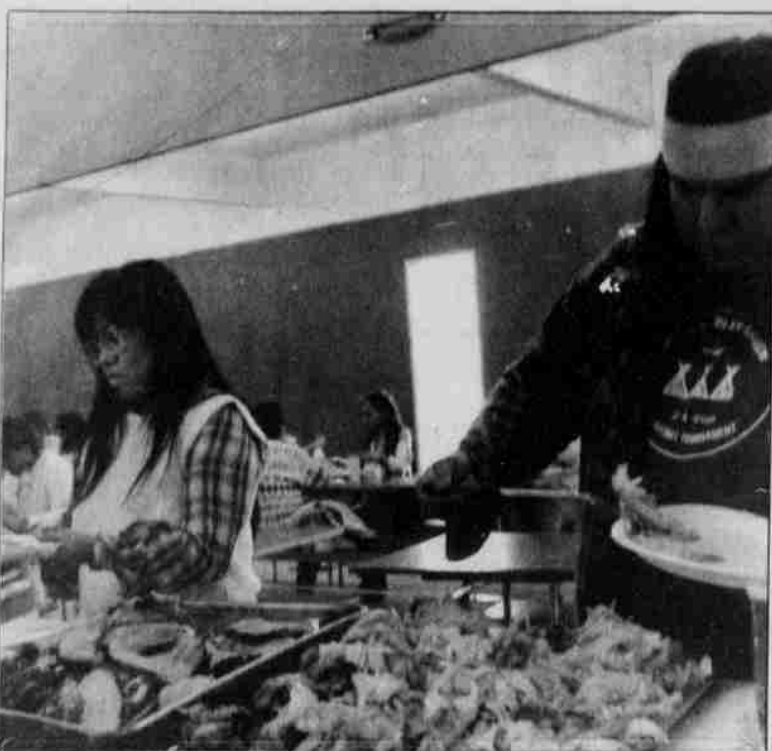

Linton Winishut

Linton Frank Winishut, a historian of the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs, died Sunday, December 10, 1989, at Mt. View Hospital in Madras. He was 83.

Linton was born June 5, 1906 in Linton to Frank and Nellie Winishut.

He was a lifetime resident of Warm Springs. He was retired as a building inspector for the Tribes.

He also worked as a blacksmith, farrier, carpenter, rancher/farmer, operated a dairy and worked in a sawmill.

He taught Indian culture and history at Central Oregon Community College and had been a tribal interpreter since 1934.

He was a tri-county councilman, chief judge working on law and order and was a member of the fish

committee. He was elected to serve on Tribal Council from May, 1953 to April, 1956 and again from May, 1962 to April, 1965.

During the time the Army Corps of Engineers was building the air base in Madras in 1941, Linton worked on the project as a surveyor.

He is survived by a son, Reggie Winishut, a daughter, Maxine Switzer and a sister, Mary Ann Meanus, all of Warm Springs. He is also survived by many grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his wife, the former Eva Brunoe, seven children, Clayton, Percy, Lorna, Rosalene, Aurelia, Harrison and Ramona Winishut; a brother, Omar Winishut; and four sisters, Emily Winishut, Nettie White, Thelma Winishut and Cecelia Walsey.
