We would like to request a few minutes of your time to fill out a short form that explains your

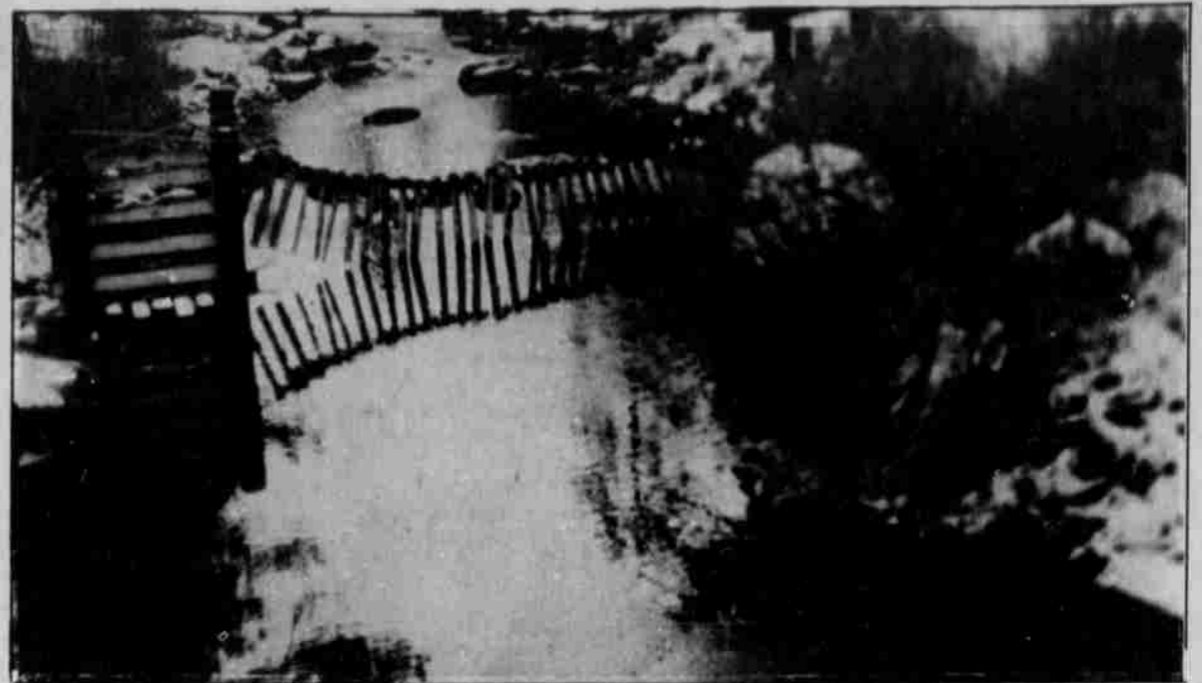

meetings. That was in 1984. I lost interest fast because the ones that were so gungho to get me to join never bothered to show up for the meetings. I got tired of hearing our World War II vets telling me how important it is to "keep our post going", "we owe it to our comrades who started the post." I used to feel guilty about it, but now I only get angry. It seems the only time any of our veterans get together is when a fellow vet dies. How sad. We vets are all special people. We all shared similar experiences. Some good, some not so good. It is time to rejoin and protect what rights and benefits we have left. The govern-

ment is continuing to cut veteran benefits. We owe it to each other to protect what we have left.

Many Indian tribes have very strong veterans organizations. Most tribes' traditions give much respect toward their warriors. Our tribe used to. What happened? People ask me "What are the veterans doing for Veterans Day?" Isn't it the peoples' responsibility to do something for us? Not anymore, I guess.

Fellow veterans, I don't mean just VFW members, I mean all vets. Let's get organized. We can do things for ourselves.

The Tribe has given us the old BIA maintenance shop for a Vete-

rans Hall, not just for VFW members. I invite you all to come to the meetings. You know who you are. Meetings are the second and fourth Tuesdays of each month. The next

meeting is February 27, at 7:30 p.m. Semper FI

Also included in the budget is \$3 million to prepare for completion of southern Oregon's Elk Creek Dam.

The president's proposal calls for \$69 million for the Bonneville replacement dock; \$16 million for fish bypass facilities on both the Columbia and Snake rivers; and \$1 million for port dredging.

Other projects included in the

budget are a \$100,000 study on deepening the Columbia River channel, \$450,000 for Columbia River Indian treaty rights, and \$140,000 to survey flooding on Multnomah and Clackamas counties' Johnson Creek. Both senators Mark Hatfield (R-Ore) and Representative Ron Wyden (D-Ore) feel the budget proposal does not reflect Northwest needs.

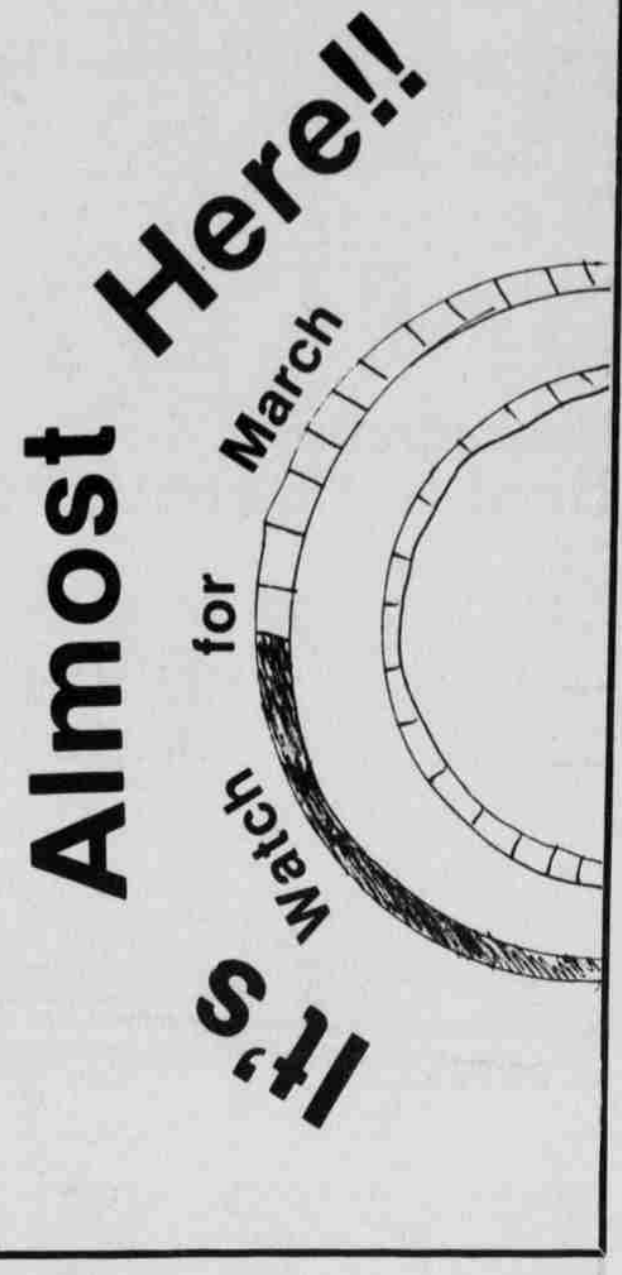
Apprenticeship opening
