

Dancer wants students to treasure heritage

Carol Newman has been dancing since she was five. She says, "I can't imagine life without dance." Emotions, stories and culture are channeled into dance, explains Newman, and "any child can re-

spond to music and dance." Working with Madras High School students during the week of February 12, the Artist in Residence is sharing her knowledge of other cultures with tenth grade

students. She has engaged them in dances from Central America, Romania and Israel. At the same time she is teaching them about the people whose cultures include these dances.

Newman brings postcards, slides, adventure stories and costumes to the classes to share with students. She wants them to get to know these people who are both different and the same as each of the students.

To help the students understand culture, Newman asks students to find out what their ancestral background is. She asks them where their great-grandparents came from and helps them "to make a connection with their heritage," she says. She also emphasizes that students "must not throw away what they've got," that is their culture.

The artist, who has traveled to many countries in the world, wants to see people learn about each other. It is in this way, she feels, "we will achieve peace." To meet this end, "children are our greatest resource," she adds.

The Astoria, Oregon based artist has taught classes in schools in elementary through college level for fifteen years. "Dance is my love," she relates. She is anxious to share it with others.
