

Please keep appointments at dental clinic

Broken dental appointments hurt the community, the dental program and you by wasting clinic time and denying treatment for others. When an appointment is broken, two things may happen. The time is unused for providing dental care of a patient may be seen for emergency treatment. Both situations are less than ideal for different reasons.

When clinic time is not used for clinic care, that time is lost and the service is lost to the community. We all know how busy the dental clinic can be, and should be, and we all know that there exists an unmet dental need in the community. Let's not contribute to the problem by wasting valuable clinic time and a community resource.

Emergency treatment is needed treatment, but it is limiting in the type and amount of treatment that can be provided. It does not pro-

vide an opportunity for the comprehensive evaluation and care that a person may need.

So, what can be done? We can do plenty because we are not helpless in this situation. First, a big responsibility will be placed on individuals to keep their appointments. Second, the dental staff will clearly explain the appointment policy at the time of the initial exam, and third, the broken appointment policy will be strictly enforced.

The broken appointment policy follows:

1. A broken appointment is the failure to show up for care at appointed time or failure to notify

clinic 24 hours in advance of need to reschedule appointment. Emergency situations are understandable and exceptions will be considered.

2. Two broken appointments will move an individual onto the waiting list, and appointments as needed will be made for the 8 a.m. emergency time.

This policy may seem strict and excessive, but the problem of broken appointments continues to handicap the dental program and the community. Abuse of the appointment time will not be tolerated and the benefit of this action will hopefully be shared by all.

Highway 26 widening project to be completed June 8

Remember when it took only 15 or 20 minutes to get to Madras? Well, since the beginning of the widening project on the grade, a "quick" trip into town might take as long as 40 or 45 minutes, given the traffic stops necessitated by construction work. But, travelers will be glad to hear that work on

the project should be complete by June 8. Blasting, which is now in progress, will end next week, according to project progress reports.

Many drivers not wishing to wait in line are taking the Campbell grade route into Madras. The trip is somewhat slow and rough, but more often than not, drivers get

into town before those who choose to sit in line.

Beginning May 1, crews will begin building the road base to prepare it for paving, which is scheduled to be complete June 8. Permanent signing will coincide with the final paving.

Another project, due to begin May 14 and end June 22, will recycle existing paving material on parts of Highway 26 from the County Line Road to Cherry Lane on the plains. Traffic will be slowed to prevent highway damage, but vehicles will probably not be stopped.

Obituary

Lawrence August Smith

Lawrence August Smith, the oldest living member of the Grand Ronde tribe, died March 29 at Mt. View Nursing Home in Madras. He was born September 1, 1896 in Grand Ronde, Oregon to Jesse and Alice (Quenell) Smith.

He was an excellent example of a hard-working, honest person who showed much compassion for people and life. He gave and didn't expect things in return. He was kind to everyone and helped many people with his wisdom, a little money, moral support and took time to listen to people. He was loving and caring and believed that people should always try their best and take pride. He was very proud of his Indian heritage and often talked about Grand Ronde. Being a simple person, he manged his life roles to his best: maintaining employment, taking care of his family, being a law abiding citizen, maintaining financial stability, helping others, being trustworthy and honest, quietly sharing his concerns and ideas about his Indian people. He had a sense of humor and didn't spend time worrying about things, holding grudges, or judging others. His values and beliefs can be seen in his children, grandchildren and other extended family.

Mr. Smith attended Chemawa Indian School and played in the band, as he had a natural ear for music, playing the cornet. Throughout his 92 years, he lived in Grand Ronde, Salem, Falls City, Perrydale, Chiloquin, Klamath Falls, Sandy and Warm Springs. He was a hard-working laborer in the logging industry and later worked for several prominent farmers in the valley as a contractor and eventu-

ally managed a small farm himself. Mr. Smith received a special recognition for having a perfect driving record during the 60 or so years he held a driver's license. Interests and hobbies included playing cards, playing a challenging checker game, smelt fishing, visiting and spending hours with his grandchildren. He was a good role model for all his grandchildren.

Surviving him are his daughters Rosemary Smith and Lorene Smith; Roy Langley; 31 great grandchildren and two great-great grandchildren. Numerous nieces, nephews and cousins from the Grand Ronde area and other parts of Oregon, Washington and California also survive.

Surviving grandchildren are Woody Smith, Chief Smith, Marty Smith, Quinton Smith, Faye Smith, Nancy Smith, all of the Seattle area; Mike Smith, Gina Ahedo, Kelly Lazore and Veda Rose Gamez, all of California; Joni Smith, Toni Made, Trudie Martinez, Dennis Smith, Marcia Soliz and Darryl Smith all of Warm Springs, and Ronald and John Smith of the Portland area.

Preceding him in death were Lawrence Smith, Irene Cunningham Smith, Valerie Smith, Ethelun Essie Smith, Gertrude McCoy Smith, Ramona Smith and Ronnie Smith.

Services were conducted April 2, 1990 at BelAir Colonial Funeral Home in Madras. Officiating were Larry Krupit and Mike Clements. Burial was at the Grand Ronde Tribal Cemetery Tuesday, April 3, 1990.
