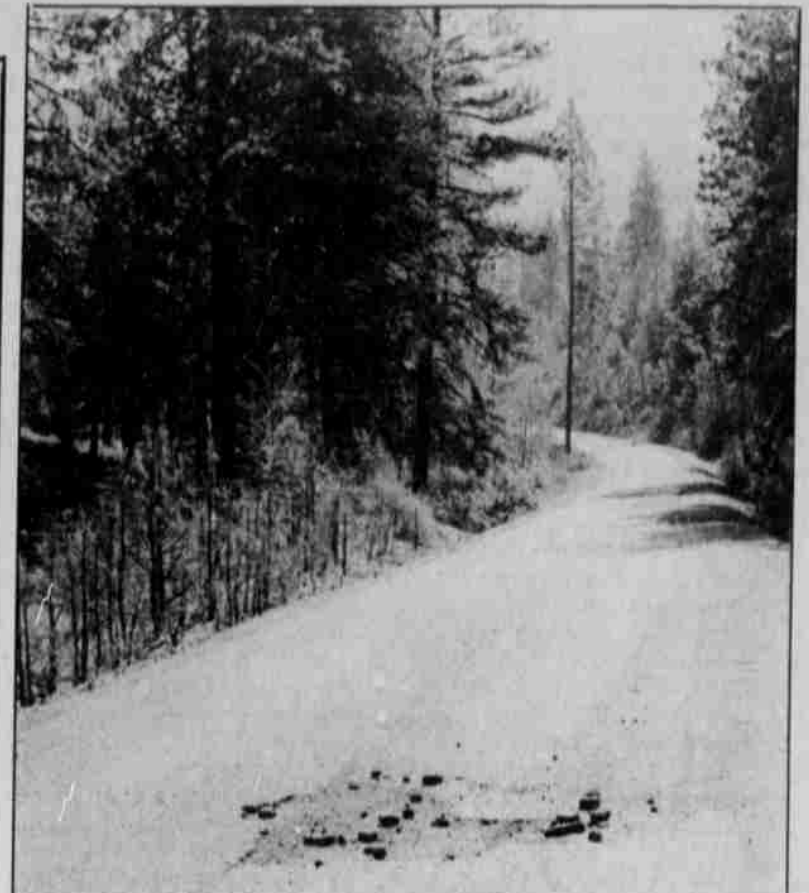

Survivors include her spouse, Johnny Howtopat, daughters Lillian Walsey, Roberta Greene and Sonya Daniels; sons Luther Danzuka, Jake Johns, Johnnie Keturra, Bruce Lee, Kevin, Corwin and Anthony Howtopat, all of Warm Springs. Marchand, Pauline Johnson, Carol Johnson Craig, Patricia Johns Brown and Barbara Johns Jim among numerous grandchildren, great grandchildren, nieces and nephews.
