Philip Guerin, age 86, died April 20 at the Mountain View Hospital in Madras. Guerin was born July 21, 1903 to Johnny and Johanna (George) Guerin in Marietta, Washington. He was an enrolled member of the Lummi Tribe.

Bessie, who died June 10, 1981. Surviving are his sons, Johnnie Guerin and Charles T. Smith, both of Warm Springs; a daughter, Phyllis Guerin Hofstetter of San Diego, California; brother Bob Guerin of Bend, Oregon; three sisters, Rose Senior of Lummi, Washington, Teresa Gibbs of Ferndale, Washington, and Myra Sycamore of Vancouver Island, B.C. Grandchildren Rodney Guerin and Susan Moody of Warm Springs, Phillip Hofstetter of Humble, Texas, Andrew Hofstetter of San Diego and Michael Smith of Warm Springs; great-grandchildren Sanmantha and Tabatha Hofstetter, Jaclyn, Joshua and Armena Moody also survive. Numerous nieces and nephews survive as well.

He attended school in Kuper Island, Canada until the age of 14 when he left home and began logging at Cucknut Bay and Bow Hill, south of Bellingham. Through the years, he continued logging, gradually moving south.

Funeral services were April 23, 1990 at Madras Evergreen Chapel in Madras with Reverend Loomis Jackson officiating. Burial was at the Simnasho Cemetery.

While logging in Sappoosne, Oregon, he met and later married Bessie David on October 6, 1936 in Vancouver, Washington. The family moved to Warm Springs and started Guerin Logging. A timber faller most of his life, who did truck driving and caterpillar work as well, Guerin spent a total of 62 years in the logging profession.

Preceding in death is his wife.

A dressing service was held for Mr. Luton Tuesday morning at 10:00 a.m. April 10th in the Merritt Funeral Home Chapel, the Body was then moved to the Wapato Longhouse for services Wednesday morning April 11th. Burial was in the Wishram Cemetery in The Dalles, Oregon.
