congressional action threatened to ban public access to eight existing boat ramps, making them available for Indian use only.

The newly designated launch sites are located at Preachers Eddy on The Dalles Pool and at LePage, both in Sherman County; Threemile Canyon in Morrow County; Avery and Cliffs, Klickitat County, Washington; Sundale and Roosevelt at Klickitat, Washington; and Crow Butte on the John Day Pool in Benton County, Washington. The Corp is in charge of managing the lands until they are improved and turned over to the BIA.

Congress in 1988 directed the Corp to develop 23 river access sites, 21 of which are on federal land, for Indian use. The law was enacted to fulfill a 50-year old promise to the four Columbia River treaty tribes to replace fishing grounds destroyed by the construction of Bonneville Dam.

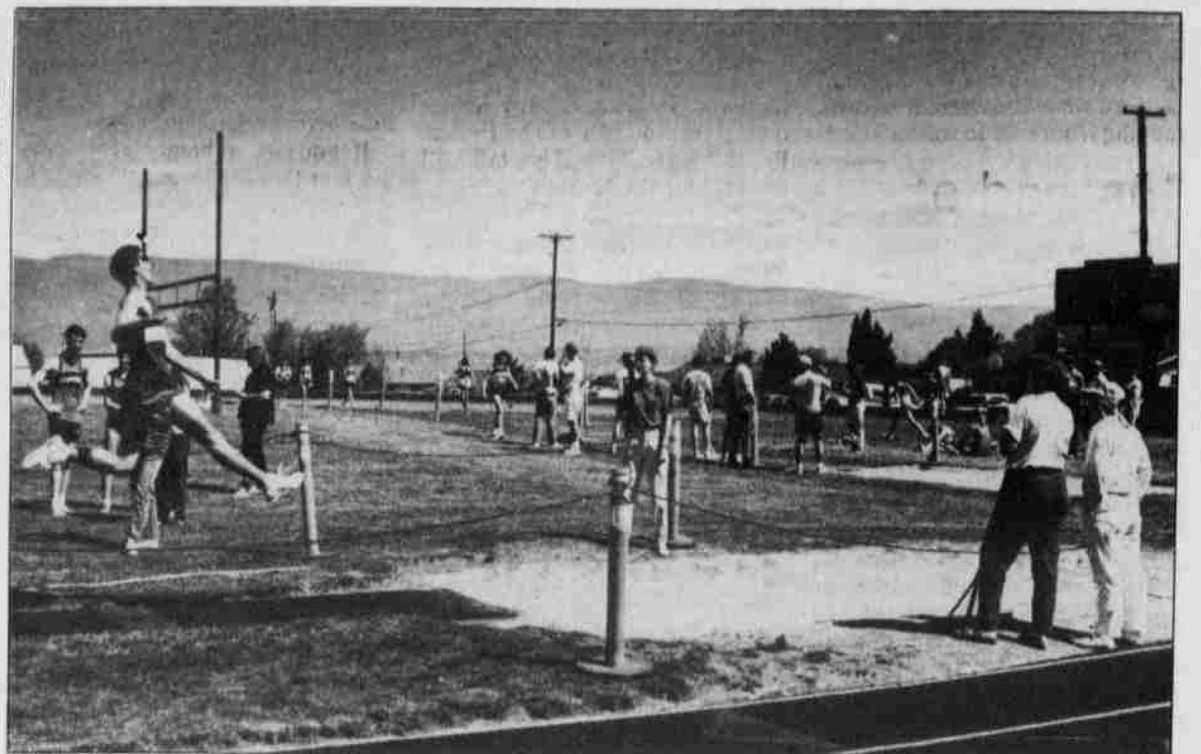
## Co-ed softball tourney set for June 1, 2 & 3
