

Apology extended to community

To the People of Warm Springs,

I would like to apologize to the people of Warm Springs for violating the Warm Springs Tribal Law Order Code, Chapter 350 Section 530,520 (3) Ceremonial hunt in a closed area.

Late last year I was involved in a ceremonial hunt off the reservation. I was arrested by the Oregon State Game Officer for hunting in an area that was closed to all hunting. Since I was representing the Tribe in the hunting I should have made sure I was in the proper area for the hunt. I didn't intentionally hunt in a closed area. At the time I thought I was in the proper area for the hunt. This case created a lot of talk and could have caused problems for the Tribes and for this reason I apologize to the people. I would never intentionally jeopardize any of the Tribes Treaty Rights by breaking any law.


