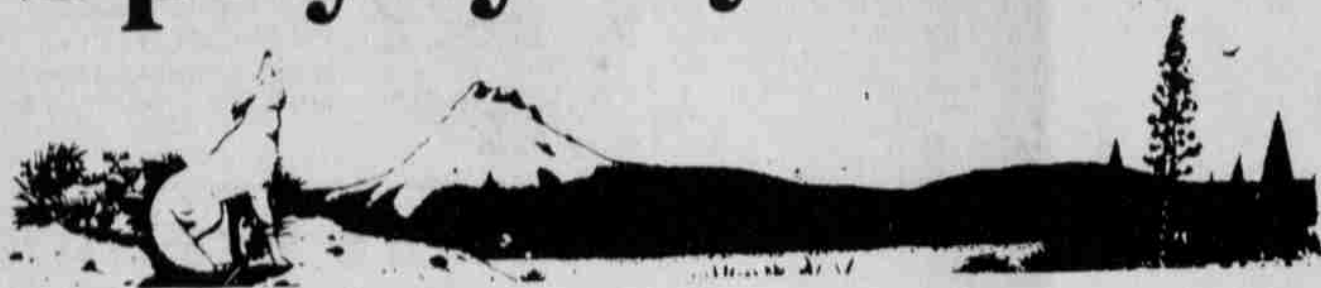
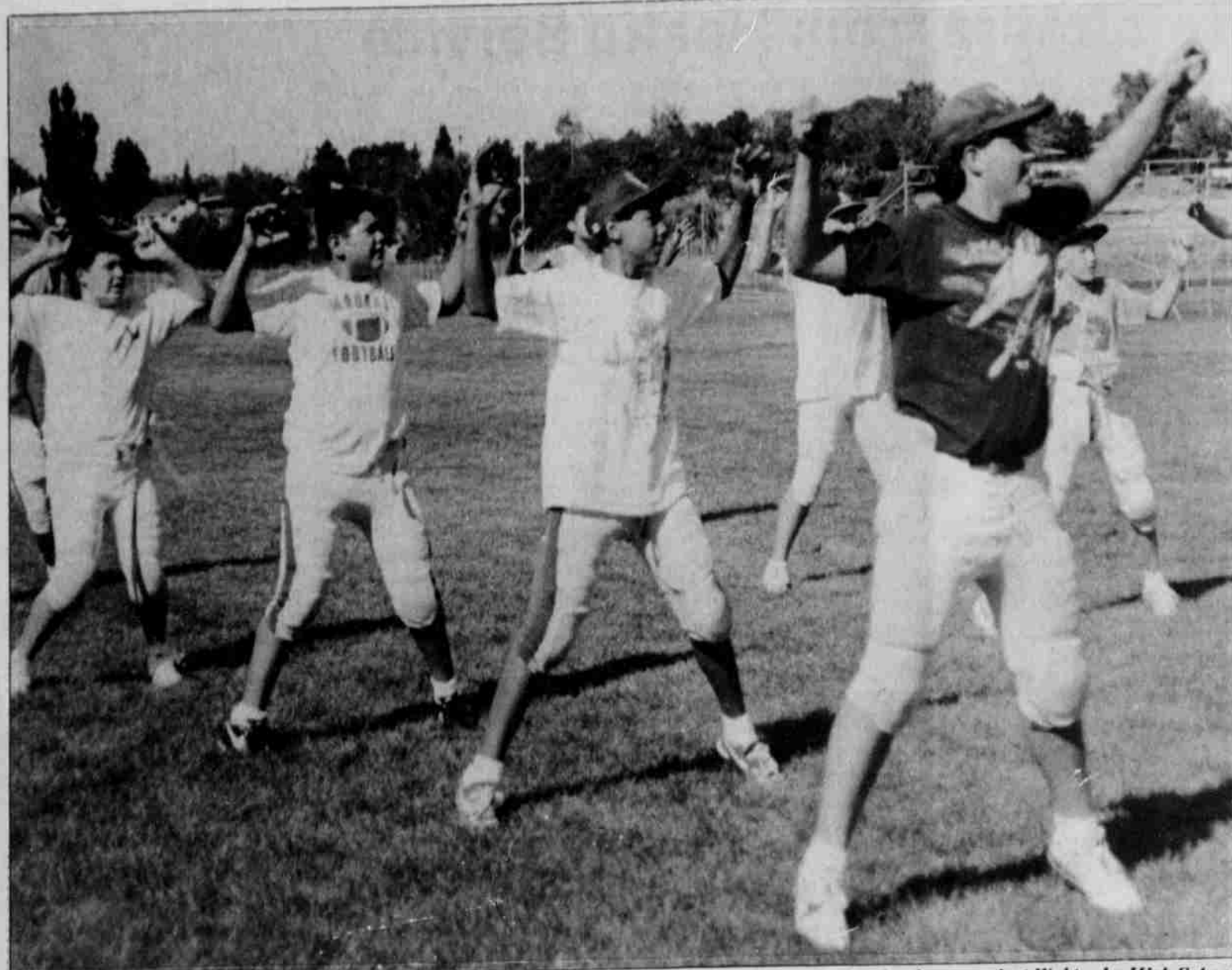

Buffaloes set early pace—defeat Seaside

In a fast pace the Buffs jumped out ahead of the Seaside Sea Gulls and never looked back as they went on to win their season opener by a convincing score of 25-7, on the Seaside gridiron. After a scoreless first quarter the Buffs put up 12 points in the second quarter to take a 12-0 half time lead behind the signal calling of Ryan Boyle. It was

a pretty strong defensive stand by the White Buffaloes that kept the Sea Gulls from scoring any points in the first half. All statistics are unofficial as they were taken from the radio station KWSO, during the game which was broadcast live from Seaside.

Madras first hit paydirt in the second quarter after an interception of a Seaside pass from Boyle

to Justin Chester to give the Buffs their first score of 6-0. The kick was no good. The second score came from a fumble recovery and a few plays later a run by Shawn Phifer who went into the end zone for the second score for the evening to put the Buffs out in front 12-0, this time a run for two points failed.

In the third quarter Tony Holiday ran the ball in for the third score for the night and the kick was blocked as the Seaside defensive unit broke through leaving the score 18-0. In the final quarter Madras hits paydirt once again and this time it was Ryan Boyle who ran the ball in with Chester

kicking the extra point putting the Buffs out 25-0. Seaside struck back in the final quarter to cross the goal line to save the shut-out where Hill ran the ball in and a kick by Morris was good to round out the scoring for each team and the final score for the game was Madras 25, Seaside 7.

The next outing for the Buffaloes will be a road trip to visit the defending state champions the Hood River Valley Eagles. On Friday night September 7, 1990, with game time 7:30 p.m.

It was good to see the Buffs get off on a good start winning their opener on the road.

WSIRA rodeo scheduled

The Walker River Pine-Nut Festival All-Indian Rodeo to be held at Schurz, Nevada, on September 15, 16, 1990. This will be a Western States All-Indian Rodeo Association Sanctioned show (WSIRA).

The regular seven rodeo events which include bareback, saddle bronc, bull riding, calf roping, steer wrestling, barrel race and team roping/go twice. Also included will be the wild cow milking, century team roping/go twice, Jr. barrel race must be 12 years old or under, pee wee barrel race for kids up to 6 years old, calf riding 12 years and under, Dummy roping for kids up to 6 years old.

The entry fee is \$40.00 per event, team roping \$40.00 per man/go twice. With all major events the purse will be \$300.00. Entry fee for the Jr. barrel race is \$10.00 and a purse of \$25.00. For the pee wee barrels, calf riding and dummy roping the entry fee is \$5.00 and a purse of \$25.00.

WSIRA Members must enter through Jeanetta Herrera, telephone (509) 874-2290. Entries open September 10, and close the 11th at 9 p.m. Books are open from 6-9 p.m. each day. Call backs on September 12, 1990.

Non-members entry should be made through Cynthia Glazier, P.O. Box 218, Schurz, Nevada, 89427. Telephone (702) 773-2561, from 5 p.m. to 9 p.m. All entries must be post marked no later than September 7, 1990. Make all entries payable to Schurz Rodeo Club. Money must accompany entry, for non-WSIRA entries. No personal checks. No wired money and there will also be a \$7.00 rodeo fee. Behind the mike will be Mike Adams. Admission: Adults \$4.00, kids 7-12 years old \$3.00, and 6 years and under free.

There will be Country and Western dance featuring "The Plainsmen," on both Friday and Saturday nights.

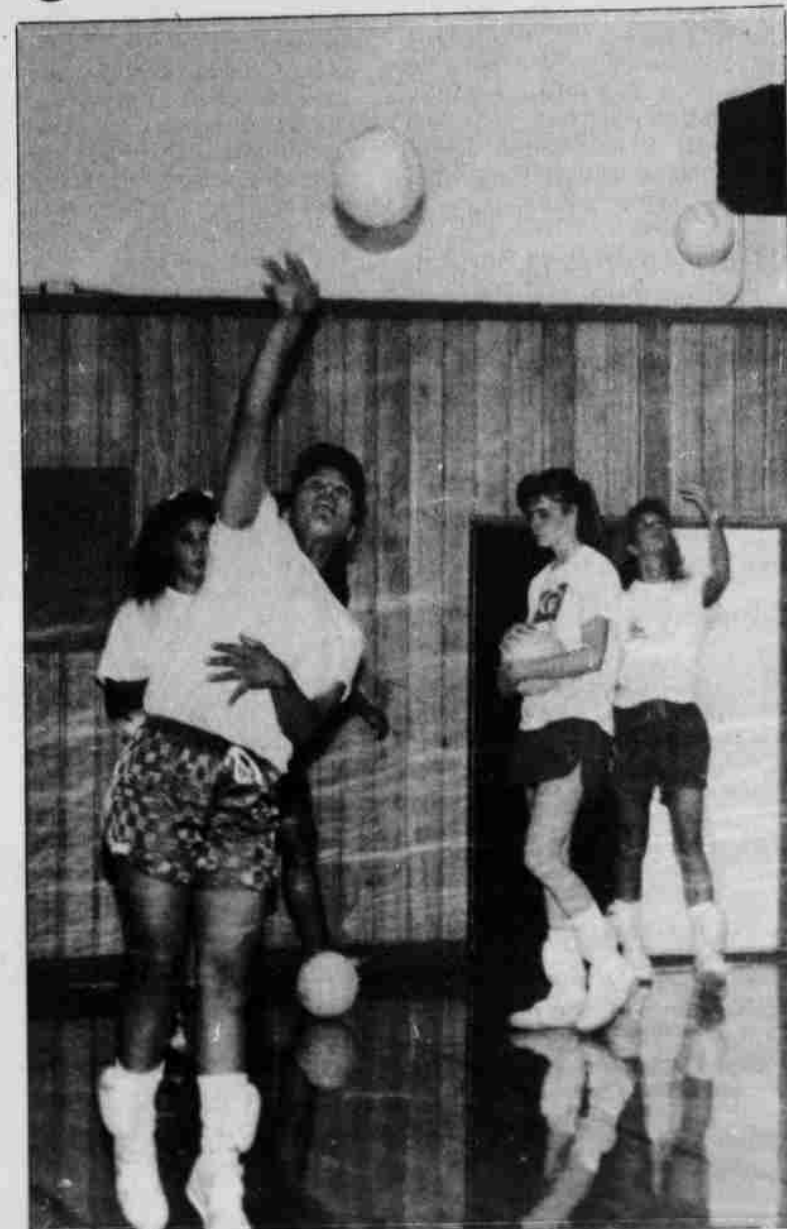
