White Buffaloes take District

The Greater Oregon League cross country meet was held in Madras, on October 27, 1990, where the Madras White Buffaloes won the championship and a trip to the state meet which will be held at Lane Community College in Eugene, on November 3.

The White Buffaloes were led by sophomore Scott Delamarter who turned in a time of 17:33, to win the race on the individual basis. The second place runner Ryan Day of Burns, turned in a time of 18:10, for second place. Another Burns Hilander, Dan Rvazewski had a

time of 18:15, for third and fourth place went to Frank Grimalso with the time of 18:16; and right on his shoulders was Madras runner Edward Heath who had a time of 18:16 for fifth. Nathan Johnson another Buff followed Heath for sixth place. Other Buff runners were Danny Story, his time 18:38 Darrin Earnest 18:49; and in 14th place was Leif Suppah 18:57; and Sam Wolfe who rounded out the Buff attack. These boys all qualified to run at the state meet at Lane Community College.

The girls fell short by two points

of winning a birth to the state meet as they were edged out by the Burns Hilanders who had 36 points to Madras 37. The Hilander girls team will go to the state meet after winning the team championship. The Madras White Buffaloes did qualify two girls to enter the state meet and they are Karen Riley who placed third over all and Arlinda Duff who placed 5th. The girls will be up against a tough field on Saturday as teams from all districts will be on hand eyeing that state championship trophy.
