#### Carolyn A. Strong Arizona monument honors Ira Hayes, veterans

The Ira H. Haves Post #84 American Legion and the In-Country Vietnam Veterans of Tempe, Arizona are engaged in an effort to construct a monument to honor Ira H. Hayes and Gila River Veterans. The monument will be located on the N.E. corner of the Sacaton Veterans Park.

The monument will be 8 feet high, 20 feet long and 3 feet deep and is composed of native stone at the base. The front of the wall facing east will have a 4'x 6' bronze relief of the Iwo Jima flag raising in

which Ira H. Hayes participated. On the wings of the monument will be a listing in bronze of Gila River Veterans who served in all the major wars: WWI, WWII, Korean, Vietnam. Special distinction will be made for KIA, MIA, POW's.

Four (4) stones from Iwo Jima have been requested which will be added to the monument. Special ceremonies will be held to receive the sacred stones on arrival by a Japanese Delegation. The sacred stones will give this monument proper consecration and be desig-
