Trustworthy, dependable, positive personality and team player.
Parole & Probation Supervisor	Five years minimum experience. BPST certified, background in working with juveniles and adults. Culturally sensitive to Indian population. Focus on developing human potential.
Secretary—Parole and Probation	High school graduate or equivalent. Two years experience minimum as a secretary. Must type 60 WPM accurately. The museum at Warm Springs has not had a formal name since its inception, although there have been several suggestions: the Warm Springs Tribal Museum; the Warm Springs Tribal Museum and Cultural Center; the Museum of the Three Confederated Tribes; the Museum of the Three Confederated Tribes at Warm Springs; the Warm Springs Heritage Center, among others. After discussion among Board members and the museum staff, we believe that now is the time to embark on a more formal community-wide campaign

to find a name. We are seeking your suggestions.

Below is a small sampling of other tribal museums around the country, each in varying stages of development and each with its own unique history. This listing is provided merely to show the range of names that other tribal museums use and so that it may stimulate thinking as the Mid-Oregon Indian Historical Society begins its effort for a name.

The deadline for submissions is February 8, 1991. Suggestions can be sent or phoned in to the MOIHS office at 553-3331 to office manager Beulah Calica. If you have ideas for logos, please submit those, too.

George "Porky" Kalama, 45 years of age, died December 20, 1990 in a drowning accident on the Nisqually River in Washington. He was born November 10, 1945 in Olympia, Washington.

Kalama was a Nisqually Indian tribal leader and worked with the Northwest Indian Fishery Commission. He also served on the tribal fishery commission.

Kalama attended school in the Battle Ground school district from

the mid-1950s to 1964. He was a Vietnam veteran who actively campaigned for Vietnam veterans' rights.

Survivors include his mother, Rosie, of Battle Ground; three sisters, Joan David of Warm Springs, and Marie and Lonzie Kalama of Olympia; one daughter, Kaleen of Gaitersburg, Maryland, and one son, John, of Olympia. Also surviving are numerous nieces and nephews.
