Construction requires building permit

All construction--removal and demolition, etc.--is required to obtain a Building Permit as per Tribal Code, Chapter 400, Articles 400.600 and 400.605. This Building Permit is a requirement whether tribal or personal.

Permits:
No building or structure regulated by this code shall be erected, constructed, enlarged, altered, repaired, improved, removed, converted, or demolished unless a separate permit for each building or structure has first been obtained from the building official.

Application for permit:
To obtain a permit, the applicant shall first file an application therefor in writing on a form furnished by the code enforcement agency:

1. Identify and describe the work to be covered by the permit for which application is made.
2. Describe the land on which the proposed work is to be done by legal description, street address or similar description that will readily identify and definitely locate the proposed building or work.
3. Indicate the use or occupancy for which the proposed work is intended.
4. Be accompanied by plans, diagrams, computations and specifications and other data as required.

5. State the valuation of any new building or structure or any addition, remodeling or alteration to an existing building.

6. Be signed by the permittee, or his authorized agent.

7. Give such other data and information as may be required by the building official.
