COCC enrollment decreases

Full-time credit headcount is down slightly at Central Oregon Community College with 33 fewer students this winter term than last

year at this time. The full-time credit headcount is at 1,094 this winter, compared to 1,127 in winter 1990.

Part-time headcount this winter is up fairly significantly by 225 students. In winter 1990 the part-time headcount was 1,780 compared to 2,005 this winter term.

Total credit enrollment is up 6.6 percent, from 2,907 in winter 1990 to 3,099 in winter 1991.

Non-credit headcount is up as well by 235 from 2,802 last winter to 3,037 this winter.

Total reimbursable FTE (full-time equivalency) saw an increase of 5.4 percent from 620.54 in winter 1990 to 654.06 in winter 1991.
