Our 20th anniversary will focus on "Indians United for Sovereignty" and NASC wants to address you personally in a request for your help. NASC is comprised of dedicated Native American students who rely heavily on the support of Indian communities here in the Northwest. In many ways this support is largely, moral and spiritual. These two gifts are essential to survival in a large mainstream institution such as the UW.

We are currently working on our Powwow Program Layout which will be distributed as a NASC publication. Combining our commitment to the Indian community with "Indians United for Sovereignty," we hope to express that message by sharing a written greeting in each respective tribe's native language. All greetings received will be displayed side by side prior to our Powwow Program section reserved for the invocation. These greetings will also be on display through promotional publications such as our official NASC poster. This poster will be made available free to "greetings" contributors and organizations on request. We want to encourage all Native peoples to participate in a show of their cultural and spiritual identity.

For those people who will be considering vending at the powwow this year, attendance is estimated to be between forty and forty-five thousand people over a three-day period. Last year the vendors were largely successful in their own right and we encourage those who may be considering this to contact us immediately and request an application. The vendor application will state fee amounts for vendor tables, table assignment locations, and other related information. All applications will be processed according to their dates received.

All drums are welcome for the championship drum competition. First prize starts at \$1500 with championship jackets and there will be six cash places in all. A total of \$5000 will be awarded for the drum competition alone. Also, we will be trying something new this year requiring each drum to bring only a 1/4" RCA or LXR plug as the standard PA system interface. This will allow each drum to take advantage of one centralized high quality sound system on the site. Those drums that wish to bring their own equipment and set-up will be assessed a set-up fee. The intent is not to discourage competition but to enhance it in a fair

manner. To further the par in fair competition, a blind judging system will be in effect, primarily based on the cumulative points earned for each grand entry made and the actual judging method used.

All dancers are welcome for Championship Traditional, Fancy and Team Dancing. Yes, even Team Dancing! Cash awards will be made to the top three places for both Mens and Womens categories. Even Juniors and Tiny Tots will find interest in the competi-

tion. Please accept my sincere intent as spokesperson for NASC and our desire to strengthen relations with all Native cultures. If you need further specific information write to Native American Student Council, at University of Washington, 3931 Brooklyn Avenue N., Seattle, WA 98105.

YCC accepting applications

Applications are now available for summer employment in the Youth Conservation Corps (YCC) program. The Deschutes and Ochoco National Forests, in cooperation with the Oregon State Department of Employment, are recruiting to fill approximately thirteen (13) positions. Work is out-of-doors performing needed conservation work including slash disposal, trail maintenance, and campground cleanup. Awareness and understanding of environmental factors will be included in the program.

Applicants must be 15 by June 1, but not over 18 by August 30 and must live within 35 miles of the work site. Previous participants are not eligible to apply. Individuals may apply to only one employment office. Duplicate applications will not be considered.

The selectees will start June 17 and work for approximately eight weeks. Pay is at the current minimum wage of \$4.75 an hour. All applicants for the Bend and Crescent jobs should apply at the Bend State Employment Office at 1007 SW. Emkay Drive, 388-6070.

Sisters and Redmond applicants should contact the Oregon State Employment Office in Redmond at 541 South Seventh, 548-8196, to apply for the Redmond Air Center jobs. All applicants for the Ochoco

National Forest positions should apply at the Redmond State Employment Office. Applications will be accepted from April 1 through May 12.

Participants will be selected after May 12 by a public drawing. Applications are available at the Bend and Redmond Employment Offices the local Ranger District offices, and at local high schools.

To: Jim Sahme
You are hereby notified. That the above cited case(s), as filed in the Warm Springs Tribal Court, has been scheduled for trial/hearing at 9:00 a.m., on the 18th day of April, 1991.

You are hereby ordered. To be and appear at the Warm Springs Tribal Court at the time and date shown to defend against the charges(s). You may be represented by yourself, by an attorney, or by a spokesman, at your own expense. You may bring any documents you believe are relevant to this cause, and you may bring witnesses to testify on your behalf. You may request the Court to subpoena your witnesses, however, you must submit your list of witnesses no later than two weeks prior to trial; failure to do so will not be considered sufficient reason to postpone the trial. If you have any questions, you should seek legal advice immediately.

If you fail to appear as so ordered, the Tribal Court shall enter a complaint for contempt of court and issue a warrant for your arrest.
