The 16th Annual Warm Springs Stick Game Tournament was held during Pi-Ume-Sha weekend in memory of Dennis Starr. It began noon on Friday June 21 with a memorial potluck and a dinner and giveaway that evening.

The games began after the memorial, with an open game involving twenty people from different reservations around the Northwest. Saturday June 22 began with twenty-seven teams from throughout the United States. Each 5-member team paid a \$125 entry fee for the double elimination tournament.

The champions of the 1991 stick games went to the Hamilton Bush team of Ft. Duchesne, Utah, they received a cash prize, along with a clock and plaque that was donated by the Dennis Starr family. The runner-up was the Vinson Simstus team of Warm Springs who received a plaque also. They came from behind losing at the beginning of the tournament and coming through the back door in the double elimination tourney to play for championship. Third place was awarded to the Terry Jack team of Canada who took home a plaque. Fourth place went to the Dayton Backhand team of Montana.

The weekend was long for the participants as the tournament lasted until Monday June 24 and ended at noon.

You are hereby ordered: To be and appear at the Warm Springs Tribal Court at the time and date shown to show cause why the suspended sentence of 3/5/91, should not be imposed for your failure to comply with the sentence imposed against you. This hearing will not be a full hearing on the merits of case; you must appear and defend against a complaint that you failed to obey the Order of the Court.

If you fail to appear as so ordered, the Tribal Court shall enter a complaint for contempt of court and issue a warrant for your arrest. If you have any questions, you should seek legal assistance immediately.
