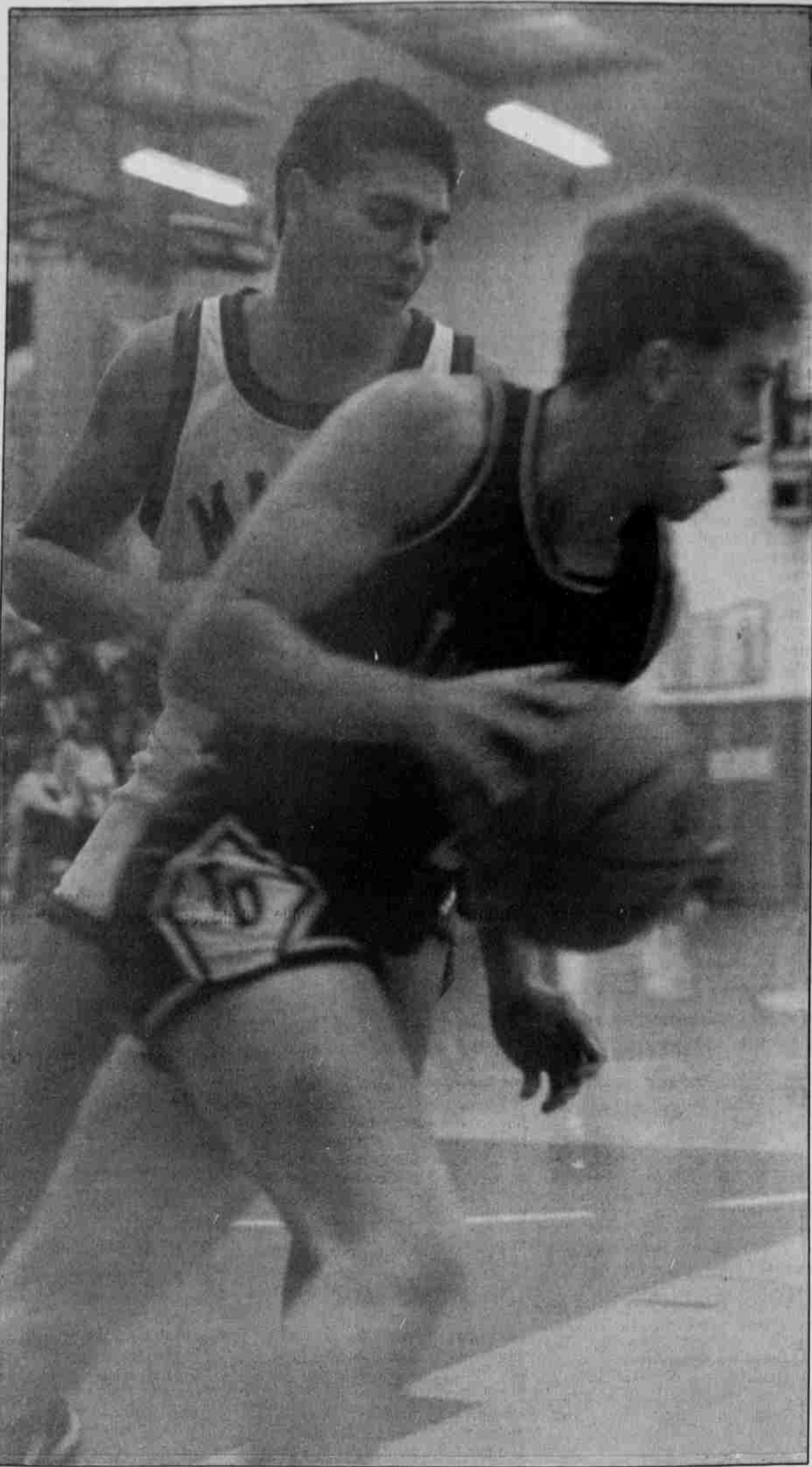

On the night of December 10, 1991, The Dalles Indians came to town only to be set back by a determined Madras team by the score of

61-55. The Buffs out scored the visitors in the first three quarters but in the final period The Dalles came storming back. After one quarter of play the score was 16-11, and at the end of the second quarter the Buffs again out scored the visitors 15-11 to make the score 31-22, at the intermission.

There were two who fouled out of the game, one from each team. For CC it was Ke Boles who committed five fouls to eliminate her from the game and for the Buffs it was Shirley Allen who ended up with five fouls.
