Numerous Early Childhood Education instructors, through practical classroom experience, have attained their Child Development Associate (CDA) credentials,

the latest being Leah Henry, who is an assistant teacher in the Head Start/Day Care program.

The CDA program is the only national effort to improve child care

by evaluating and recognizing the skills of the individuals who provide care. It is an ongoing program that has so far involved 19 ECE staff members. The CDA credentials are

competency-based and involve classroom participation.

## New ECE building will allow expanded services

If you have driven up past the Agency Longhouse lately you've probably noticed the new Early Childhood Education Center is coming right along. The contractor is scheduled to hand the building over to the tribes on March 15th. At that time the Early Childhood Administrative office will move in. The week of March 30th (spring break) Day Care and Head Start/Day Care will close down and move into the new center. Parents/Guardians of children in Day Care or Head Start/Day Care need to be aware that they will have to make other arrangements for child care over spring break. The Head Start/Part Day and Tribal Preschool programs will move into the new center in June.

None of the programs will expand until the start of the new school year in September, 1992. Pre-registration for preschool in the fall will be in April and May with re-registration in June.

The major goal of the new E.C.E. Center's Preschool program is to serve 100% of the 4 year olds in our community; to provide a preschool experience for a successful transition into Warm Springs Elementary. To achieve that goal Early Childhood needs to know how many 4 year olds will need to be served in the Fall. If your child will be 4 years old on or before September 1, 1992 and is not currently enrolled in Head Start 3's, Head Start/Day Care 3's or Tribal Preschool 3's or is not currently on a waiting list, please contact Sue Matters in the Head Start office, 553-3561.
