The Madras White Buffaloes No. 1 seed from the GOL to State

After a year of ups and downs and things looked a little dim at times, the Madras White Buffalo boys hung in there to eventually emerge the No. 1 team from the Greater Oregon League.

At the end of regular play the Madras White Buffaloes were tied with the Nyssa Bulldogs, as each having a 9-3 record. A play off game was held on a neutral court which was in Burns. The Madras White Buffaloes came out the winners to take the No. 1 seed at the state tourney.

The State play-offs once again held in Eugene at the MacArthur court on the University of Oregon campus. In their first game they will play on Wednesday, March 12, at 1:30 p.m. where they will face the No. 2, team from the COWAPA league team which is the Astoria Fishermen, who are a highly re-

spected team from that league. Should the Madras Buffs win that game their next game will be at 7 p.m. Thursday. Should they lose their first game they will play at 9 a.m. on Thursday.

Leading the way for the Buffs will be Ryan Boyle, Scott Moses, Ryan Grote, Mark Harris, Spencer Gerke, Leif Suppah, Shane Barnes, Jeb Butler, Tom Norton and Scott Delamarter.

Many remember a year ago when most of the sports writers never gave the Madras boys a chance to get anywhere. But with determination they played well and lost in the championship game by one point to the highly rated Cottage Grove team, who was ranked No. 1 all season long. This is altogether a different year with a lot of new teams at the state tournament and it should be very interesting.

Madras Girls' try falls short at State Tournament

Two wins and two losses for the Madras White Buffalo girls basketball team at the state play-offs which concluded on March 14, 1992, at the Salem Armory.

In the opening game the Buff girls pulled out a close win over the Siuslaw, team by the score of 66-64. Siuslaw was out to get the Buffs to avenge losses of prior years at the state tourney. They came close and took a short lead with just a few minutes left in the game. The Buffs were not about to be beaten as Laura Sahme answered with a three pointer to regain the lead for the Buffs for good as they went on to win the game. It was a good team effort that got the win for Madras. All the teams the Buffs played they were at a disadvantage height wise. In their second game they were put up against the highly rated Marist team who showed they deserved their rating as they just about buried the Buffs alive. The Buffs held their own in the opening quarter, but slowly started to deteriorate as the game went on and the Marist team got stronger to maul the Buffalos to win the game 61-32. It looked as though the Buffs were handcuffed during the game as they couldn't seem to find the handle on the ball as there were turn over after turn over by the Buffs and the Marist team capitalized on them and scored many points.

With the Marist massacre in the past the Buffs took to the floor to meet the Scappoose Indians and did to them what Marist done. The Buffs jumped right out after trailing 2-0, to

tie the game and then take the lead for good. Early in the game Scappoose tied the game a couple of times, but once the Buffs got on track it was clear sailing to victory. They took a 19-12 first quarter lead and led 32-20 at the half time break. In the third quarter the Buffs exploded on a 26-12 scoring spree to jump way out front of the Indians. In the final quarter the Scappoose team made a run after the Buffs out scoring Madras 17-14, but that was way shy of coming near catching up the Buffs. Late in the game the Buffs lost one of the regulars with a knee injury, that of Laura Sahme, who popped her knee and tore some ligaments sidelining her for the duration of the tournament. Laura kept the defense on their toes with her outside shooting ability. When the defense sagged in on the post players she would unload with the outside bombs to open things up on the inside.

The final showdown for the Madras White Buffalos was against a highly rated Silverton team. In the early stages of the game the Madras team out hustled the Silverton team to take a 16-8 first quarter lead. Silverton slowly closed in on the Buffs closing the score to a 24-21. Buff lead at the half time intermission. In the third quarter the Silver Foxes went on a scoring spree on a 19-9 romp over the Buffs. And in the final quarter they took a 11-5 scoring spell and go on to win the game 51-38. During the second half the Silverton team took advantage of the perimeter shooting and bottled up

the lane on Madras where they couldn't get many good shots.

In the first half for field goals Madras was 9-19, at a 47.4%, Silverton was 9-28 for 32%. Free throws in the first half the Buffs were 6-7 for 87.7%, Silverton was 2-2 for 100%. In the second half Madras was 4-5 for 80% and Silverton was 8-14. Final Madras from the free throw

line was 83.3% to 62.5% for Silverton.

It was the second half where Silverton battled up the post players where they couldn't get the good shots. The tourney ended with Henley getting the consolation trophy, Silverton 4th, Marist 3rd, Molalla runner-up and Central of Independence the state champions.

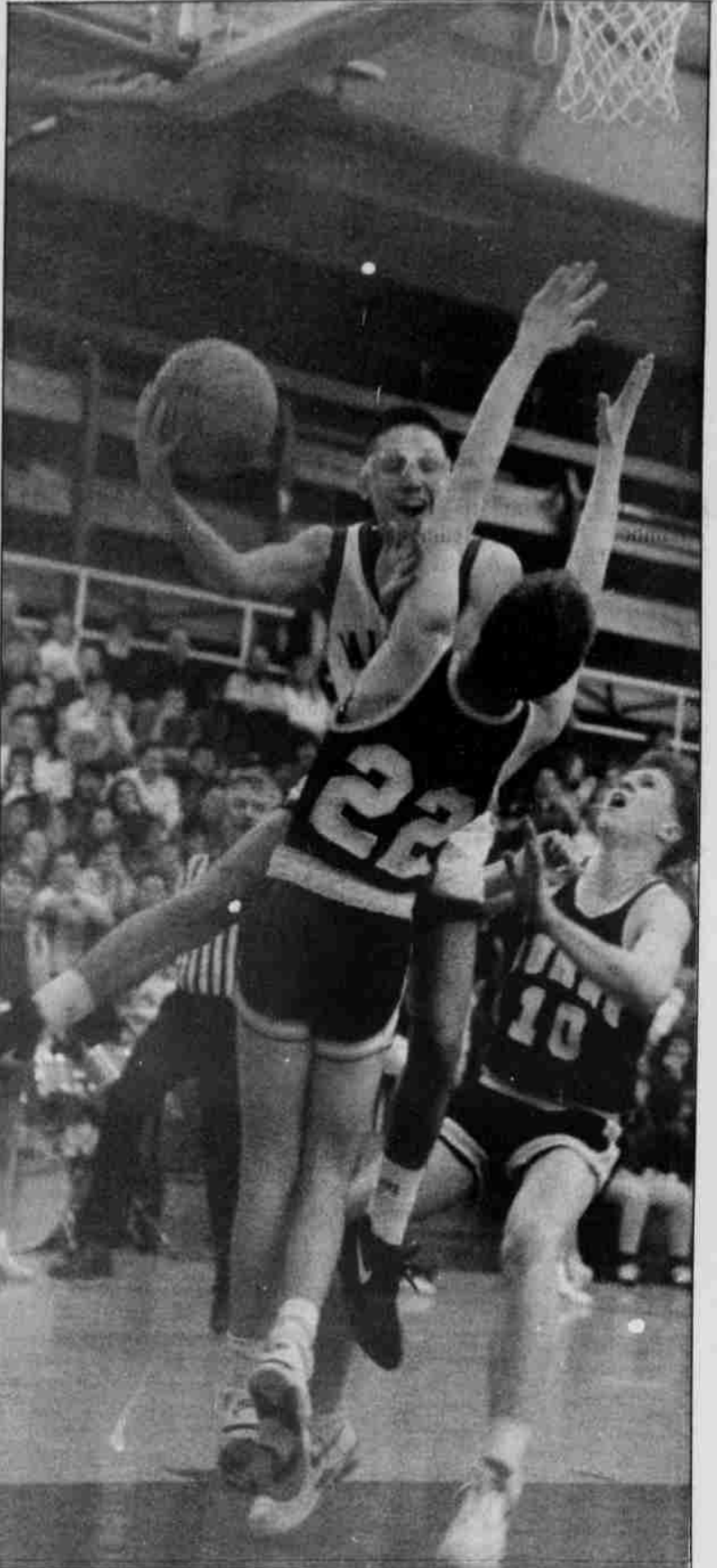
13 & Under Boys Basketball Tourney
