## Buffs win league opener 29-0

"As I seen it", The White Buffalo fans really had something to cheer about last Friday night as the White Buffaloes stampeded over the visiting Riverside Pirates. It was go right from the start of the game when the boys seemed to have everything under control and whopped the Pirates by the score of 29-0. This was the opening conference game for both schools of the Greater Oregon League.

What a perfect night for a football game. The weather was very comfortable with a cool breeze but nothing to get excited about. It was mild and the fans made it hot as the game went on. The chill of the autumn was in the air but that didn't cool the Buff team as they came out ready to play some football and that they did. Everything looked pretty much in the Buffs favor right from the word go. Even during the pre-game warm ups it looked like a Buff night, with every one eager and fight in their eyes. The Buffs won the toss and elected

to receive and marched right down the field in three big gainers when Shawn Phifer entered the game got a hold of that Pig-Skin and darted to the left beating the defenders to the corner and when he turned up field there was nothing in front of him but the goal line as he sped down the sideline to score the first TD for the night. With a big satisfied look on coach Reese's face he said, "The first time he touches the ball he runs it in for the score." And the Buffs were out front 6-0. the try for the extra point the Buffs were penalized and set back for another try, this time it was for a two pointer on a pass that was good but holding set them way back and a third try on a pass from Barnes to John Boyle to make the score 8-0.


After a series of down by the Pirates the Buffs received the kick and had the ball on fourth down and some

Barnes took the snap as Boyle darted down the sideline he took the long pass from Barnes and was on his way to pay dirt untouched. The third TD came also in the second quarter when the Pirates seemed to have a little drive started, but the quarterback was hit by a Buff defender as he started to lateral causing a fumble where a Madras defender pounced on the ball. A motion penalty took the Buffs back, on second a 12, the Buffs were thrown back on the two yard line with third down and whole lot of yards. At that point Shane Barnes with good protection connected with John Boyle crossing over the middle around the 40 yard line with a long bomb that exploded for six when Boyle caught the ball he was on his way for the goal line, where he just out ran the Pirate defender. Again DiCintio's kick was good and the score was 22-0, as the first half came to a close. The second half got underway on

a boot from Claude Smith, III, as he was doing the kick-off chores all evening long. He also had an outstanding game both on offense and defense. Others who were having a good game was Frank Recse on le-fense, Joede Goudy at Center, Charlie Wewa on defense along with a hoist of Buffs on each play. The team was fired up after a disappointing loss to the Crook County Cowboys a week earlier where things sort of slipped out of their hands.

The next game for the Buffs will be at Milton-Freewater with the Mac Hi Pioneers, and Rod Chester, the former head football coach of the Buff team. With game time at 7:30 p.m. The Buffs have a score to settle after losing to Mac Hi last year.
