# Burn hot fires to reduce air pollution

Burning wood for home heating is the fastest growing source of air pollution in Oregon.

How can you help?

Burn dry, seasoned wood. Dry wood burns cleaner and you get more heat than from unseasoned wood. Cure split wood by raising it off the ground and covering it. Cut it early in the spring or summer so it can dry by

restoke. Small fires with plenty of oxygen burn cleanest. If you need to stoke up your fire, burn it briskly for 30 minutes. Then damp it down, but not too much. Check your stack and clean your chimney. A small amount of smoke
