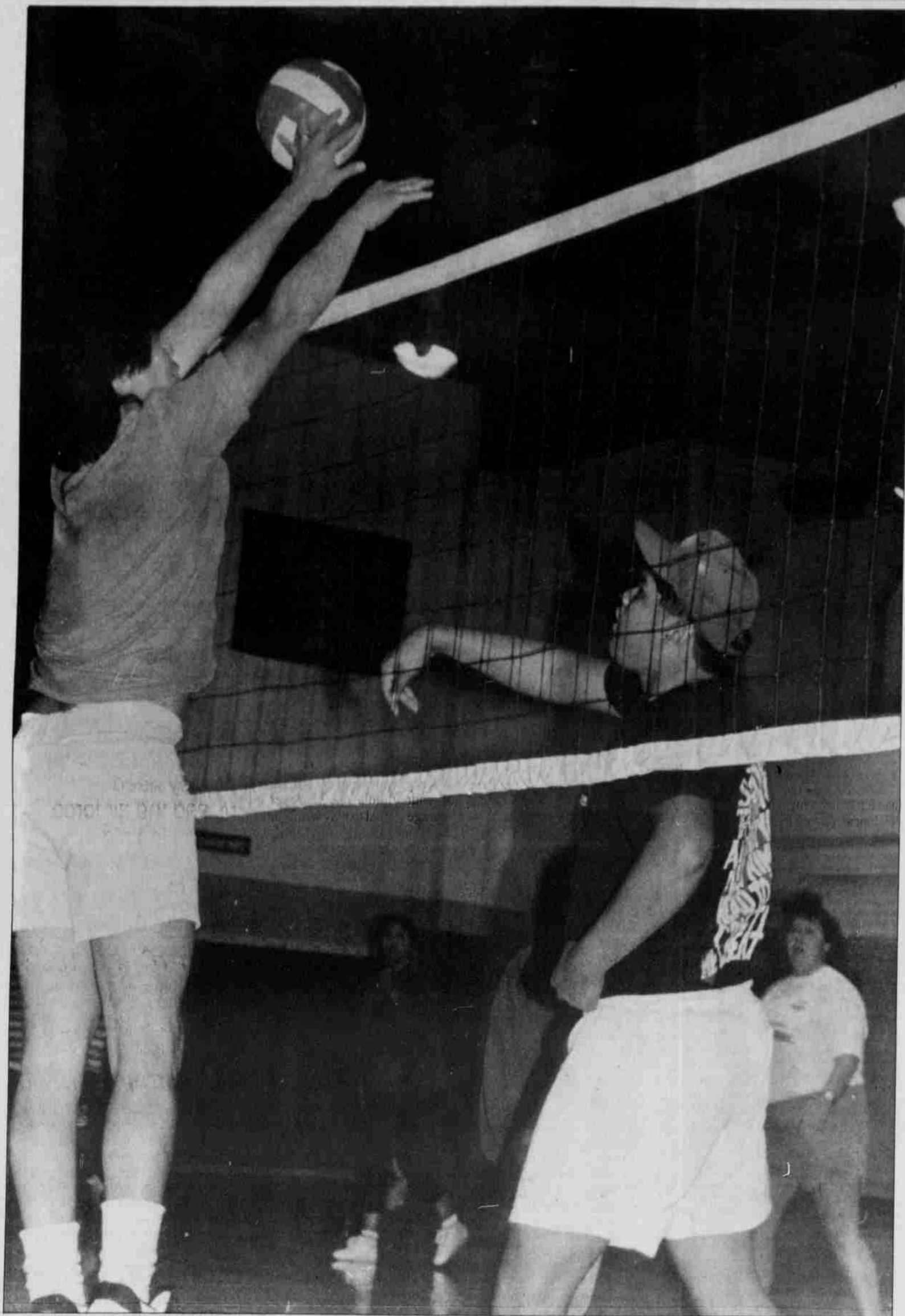

### Volleyball season winds down....

#### Varsity, junior varsity teams meet opponents

The varsity volleyball team hosted Burns Thursday, October 29, 1992. The Buffs fell short 9-15, 5-15 to the Hilanders. They served 85% as Stephanie Harris was 9 for 9. Offensively the Buffs totaled 13 for 15 kills. Coach Margaret Sturza stated, "I felt we were never mentally in the game. Burns played very well—they got everything up, which is evident, when you see that we only got 13 kills on offense."

Friday, October 30, 1992 the Junior Varsity volleyball squad

hosted Burns and defeated the Hilanders in three games. The first game MHS fell short 1-15 as Burns came on strong right from the start. The only point MHS made was a kill from Rebecca Grote. In game two, consecutive serves played a key role as Madras won 15-3. The third game was close as the Buffs came out on top 16-14. Burns received two "In the net" calls and an illegal backrow attack. Serving was at 94%, Betsy Cordill was 11 for 11 and Brook Luther was 9 for 9.

The J.V. squad then participated in a five team tournament on Saturday, October 31 at Mt. View High School. The other four teams included Bend, Lakeview, Redmond, and Mt. View. The teams played round robin style throughout the day and played two games to 15 points.

For the Buffs, the scores were as follows: vs. Redmond 15-11, 15-5, vs. Lakeview 15-9, 15-7, vs. Mt. View 15-8, 15-8, and vs. Bend 15-10, 12-15 which gave them a 7-1 record. Coach Marsha Armstrong felt, "They played their best ever!" "I felt like the team, excited to have beaten the bigger schools." Coach Armstrong felt both offense and defense did a terrific job. Serving was 92 percent for the day (182/196).

After the round robin series one game to 15 was played for single elimination. The Buffaloes came up to play Bend and lost 11-15, as Bend went on to win over Mt. View. The Buffs took home third place. The junior varsity team showed everyone how well they could perform as a team. Coach Armstrong stated, "It was good to see them play to their potential. I'm proud of them!"

### Fitness Challenge underway

The 1992 November Fitness Challenge sponsored by the Recreation Department has begun November 1 and will continue to November 30. If you and your group have not entered yet, the deadline for entries is Friday, November 13. This is also the deadline for T-shirt orders. Sign up is now being accepted at the Recreation office.

To enter you are required to pay a \$3.00 fee, and if you wish to receive a T-shirt the fee is \$5.00. Pick up your individual time sheet logs. Select a person to be captain and he/she will be the contact person for your team.

Any organization is eligible to enter, for example: Warm Springs Tribal Organization, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Indian Health Service, Warm Springs Elementary, Kah-Nee-Ta, and any outside individual, group or organization.

Acceptable exercises are only specific activities engaged for exercise reasons. These include: walking, jogging, running, bicycling (outdoor/indoor), swimming, skiing (downhill/cross country), and aerobic dance. Others include: weightlifting, handball, racquetball, skating (ice/roller), conditioning

exercise, and pickleball.

In addition, these exercises will be limited to specific amounts of time each day: Horseback riding, 1 hour; Tennis, 1 hour; Volleyball, 1 hour; Basketball, 1 hour; Bowling, 45 min.; Boxing, 1 hour; Dancing, 1 hour; Hunting, 1 hour; Woodcutting, 1 hour; and Golf (no cart), 1 hour.

Team captains are to get all of your teams individual time logs in by Tuesday, December 1 for totalling.

An awards luncheon will be held Friday, December 11, 1992 at noon in the Social Hall of the Community Center to present awards and T-shirts.

### Winter rodeos scheduled for November, December, January, February

The Alps Rodeo Stock contractor presents the Winter Indoor Rodeos for the 1992-93 event. The first of four rodeos will be held November 14, 15, 1992, with the starting time of 1:00 p.m. There will be Slack after the Saturday rodeo if needed.

The second rodeo will be held December 12, 13, 1992 with show time at 1:00 p.m. The third rodeo will be held January 16, 17, 1993, and the final of the four rodeos will be on February 20, 21, 1993.

Rodeo events will include Bull Riding, Saddle Bronc, Bareback, Calf Roping, Team Roping (enter twice), 2 loops, open gate, Steer Wrestling, Wild Horse Race. All the above events the entry fee will be \$35.00, the Team Roping is \$35 per man, also the Wild Horse Race the fees are \$35.00 per man.

Other events include Breakaway Roping, Barrels 14 and over, Goat Tying 14 and over, Jr. Bulls ages 14-

16, all these entry fees are \$25.00. Other events are Jr. Barrels, Goat Tying 13 and under, and Calf Riding 13 and under all these entry fees are \$15.00.

Books open for each rodeo on the days of November 9, December 7, January 11, and February 15. Call backs November 12, December 10, January 14, and February 18. Phone 475-2845. No personal checks. Cash or money orders only, payable to Alps Rodeo Stock. Office charge of \$5.00, for the events for the 13 and under events, and \$10.00 for all other events. Some events may be limited.

Buckles awarded to high point in each event at the end of the series, and a trophy saddle to the All Around Winner. Points given to 6th place. If a team roper places twice he will receive points for the highest placing only.

Admission is General \$3.00; Kids, \$2.00; Under 6 years old free.
