

Oregon Athletics take trophy in Holiday Tournament

OR, Ath. 30 46 29 20 = 125 Magpies 22 27 22 34 = 105 The Annual All Indian Holiday

Tournament held here in the Community Center December 30, 31, January 1, 2, drew top teams from the Pac Northwest filtering down to the final two who vied for the championship. The two teams who made it there were the defending champions, The Oregon Athletic team and also last years runners up the Warm Springs Magpies.

The OA team jumped out fast to build an eight point first quarter lead. The saying goes, "When your hot, your hot." That's the way the OA team came out all fired up to defend their title. They hit four 3-pointers and it appeared everything they threw up went in like there was a magnet in the basket. While the Magpies were not so fortunate as their shots didn't fall through enough to keep pace with OA. Brooker Jones had the hot hand in the first quarter getting two 3-pointers two baskets and one free throw for 11 points in the opening quarter of the game. 


Redmond girls top Buff gals
