The Tribal Council of the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Reservation would like to announce the following vacancy:

Article VI
Section 1. NAME. The body from which the Board of Directors shall be selected and which shall serve as primary advisory body to The Museum and the Board of Directors shall be referred to and known as the Board of Regents.

Section 2. NUMBER. The Board of regents shall consist of not less than seven (7) nor more than 45 members.

Section 5. CONDUCT OF BUSINESS. The Board of Regents shall act as the primary advisors to the Board of Directors and may be appointed to committees formed by the Board of Directors for the conduct of business of The Museum. The Board of Regents shall participate in and contribute to the following activities:

1. Raising capital and operating funds for The Museum.

2. The Academic and Cultural affairs of The Museum.

3. All other activities in aid of the purposes for which the Museum was established.

Section 6. MEETINGS. Meetings of the Board of Regents shall be held at least two times during the course of each year. The time and place of meetings shall be fixed by the Chairman, and reasonable notice of such meetings be given to each regent.

Section 14. COMPENSATION. Non-Tribal members of the Board of Regents shall serve without compensation. Tribal members and members

who are also members of the Board of Directors shall be compensated in the manner provided in Article IV, Section 15.

Article IV Section 15. COMPENSATION AND EXPENSES. The directors shall be compensated in the same manner as members of the Tribal committees. Expenses incurred in connection with the performance of their official duties shall be reimbursed to directors upon approval of the President of the Board. Directors' expenses shall be an expense of The Museum.

Article IV:
Section 4. Appointment. The members of the Board of Directors shall be appointed by the Council.

Section 8. General Powers. The business and affairs of WSAI shall be managed and controlled by the Board of Directors.

Section 9. Regular Meetings. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held semi-annually on the first Monday in the months of February and August for the purpose of reviewing the preceding six months' operations, and the transaction of such other business as may come before the meeting.

Section 10. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by the Chairman of the Board or any three members of the Board of Directors.

Meetings shall be held at the time and place specified by the person or persons calling such meeting.

Section 16. Compensation and Expenses. The Council shall, from time to time, determine a reasonable per diem to be paid to the members of the Board of Directors for time devoted to meetings and affairs of WSAI. Expenses incurred in connection with performance of their official duties may be reimbursed to directors. Directors' per diem and expenses shall be an expense of WSAI.

Secretary-Treasurer/CEO is directed to develop an affirmative action program in order to implement this policy."

Ten members of Tribal Council were present when the resolution was approved on January 24. Of those ten, eight voted yes, one abstained and the chairman did not vote.

Resolution #8363A basically adds leverage to the original document in that the tribal member preference policy extends to contractors, subcontractors and to those who deliver goods and services on the reservation. The first four paragraphs of #8363A are identical to those in #8363 following is Resolution #8363A beginning with the fifth paragraph.

"Whereas, The Tribal Council reaffirms Resolution No. 8363 and affirms its original intent to include, Tribal member preference in contracting, subcontracting and delivery of goods and services through this clarification by amending and restating in its entirety Resolution No. 8363, and

Whereas, All Tribal members should be afforded maximum opportunities in employment, contracting, subcontracting and the delivery of goods and services with the tribe, its entities and tribal enterprises; and

Whereas, The Tribal Council believes it is most appropriate to adopt a preference policy by resolution in order that it can be tested, evaluated, and refined prior to adoption in the form of an ordinance; now, therefore,

Be It Resolved, By the Tribal Council of the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Reservation pursuant to Article I, Section 1, Article V, Section 1 (f) and (l), and Article VIII, Section II, of the Tribal Constitution, that the basic employment, contracting, subcontracting and delivery of goods and services preference for the Confederated Tribes, its enterprises and subordinate organizations shall be as follows:

1. Tribal members. Tribal members shall be preferred over all other applicants for any job opening or promotion and any position shall be awarded to a tribal member if there is a tribal member applicant for the position who meets the qualifications;

2. Married into the Tribe (MIT). Individuals that meet the qualifications who are legally married to an enrolled tribal member or who is a parent providing support to a minor enrolled tribal member shall be preferred over all other non-member applicants in the filling of any vacant positions;

3. Other Indians. Enrolled members of other federally recognized tribes shall be preferred for employment over non-Indians, that who meet the qualifications.

Be it further resolved, That the Secretary/Treasurer/CEO is directed to develop an affirmative action program in order to implement this policy."

Ten members of Tribal Council were present at the November 12 meeting at which this resolution was adopted. Nine voted in favor of the document while the chairman did not vote.
