## Madras wins big over Ontario

On Friday night the Buffaloes ran rough shod over the Ontario Tigers pounding out a 78-56 convincing win behind the sharp shooting of Leif Suppah's 25 points for the night before he fouled out in the final quarter. Suppah's efforts were not only in scoring but on defense and under the backboards as he pulled

down more than his share of rebounds. It was an outstanding night for the senior guard who played a great game. The Buffs got the jump on the Tigers and never gave them a chance to regroup. Ontario is always a strong team and can beat almost any team around. This night belonged to the Madras boys as there were four players in double figures as Tom Norton added 17, Mark Harris 12, Shane Barnes 10, while Scott Delamarter added 8, Ben Christensen

2, K.C. Ring 2, Spencer Gerke 2. In the three point range Leif Suppah swished 3 of them Tom Norton had one for the Buffs and Johnson one for the Tigers.

The Madras White Buffaloes led through the game as the Ontario Tigers were able to close the gap to a few points just once but the determined Buffs pulled away. At the end of the first quarter the score was 9-16, for the Buffs and they went into the intermission holding a commanding lead of 37-22. It was just a tremendous team effort throughout the game. In the third quarter the Tigers out scored the Buffs 19-16, but the Buffs maintained the large lead leading 53-41. In the final quarter it was all a Buff game as they swished the nets for 25 points to 15 for the Tigers to make the final score 78-56, and a big win for the Buffs.

The Tigers made a game effort to keep pace with the Buffs behind the scoring of Barmett and Easterly who had 19 and 17 points respectively, Johnson 6, and Johnston 4, Wilson 3, Edwards 3, T. Grimm 2, B. Grimm 2, Holton, Snyder.

This ran the Buffs record to 4 wins 0 losses in league play by defeating the Tigers who were also on a winning streak.

On February 6, 1993 the Buffs travel to Burns to meet the Hilanders who are always tough on their home floor and are highly rated in the GOL.

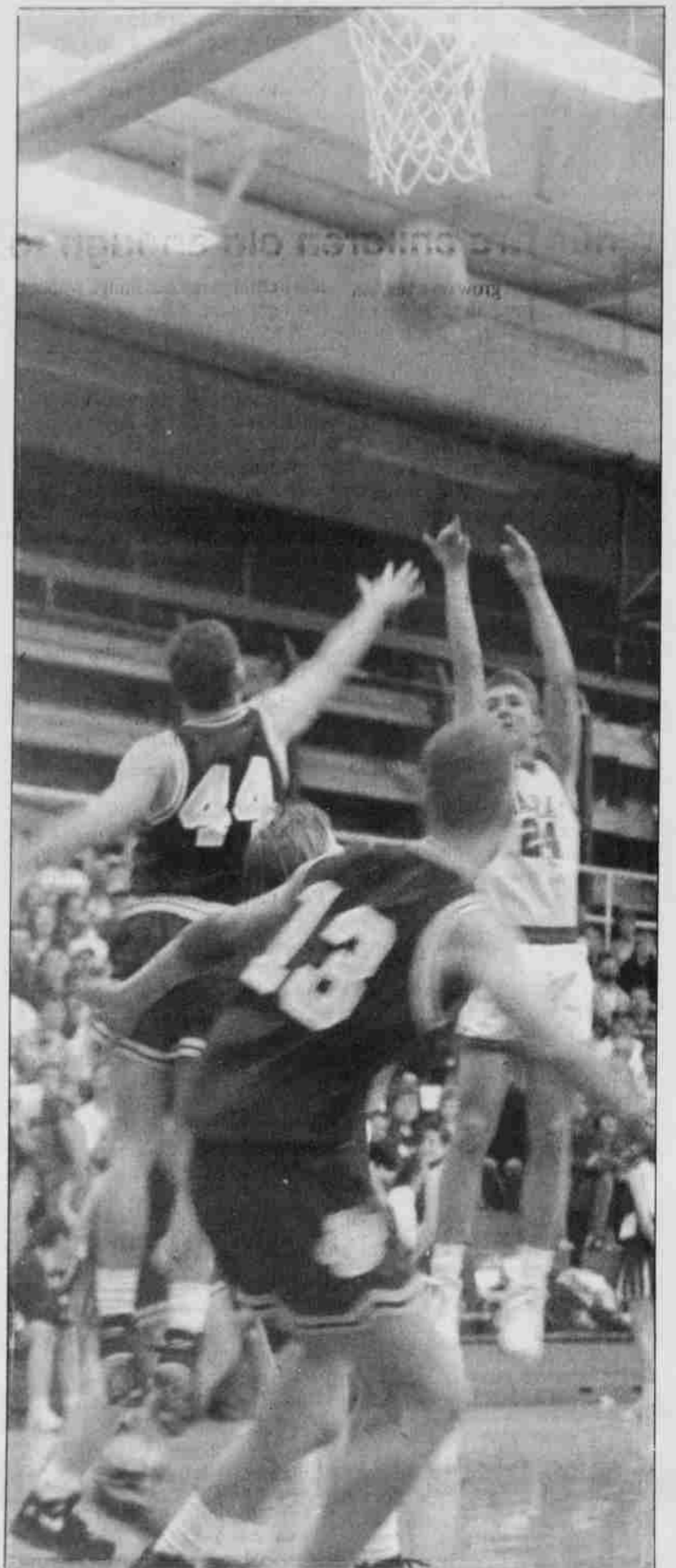
### February 12, 13, 14... Boys Basketball tourney set
