You are hereby notified that a petition for Civil Complaint has been filed with the Warm Springs Tribal Court.

You are hereby ordered to be and appear at the Warm Springs Tribal Court at the time and date shown, to show cause why the suspended sentence of 01/13/93, should not be imposed for your failure to comply with the sentence imposed against you. This hearing, will not be a full hearing on the merits of the case; you must appear and defend against a complaint that you failed to obey the Order of the Court.

By this notice you are summoned to appear in this matter at a hearing scheduled for 3 p.m. on the 13th day of July, 1993, at the Warm Springs Tribal Court. All of the facts of the case will be heard at this hearing, including evidence you wish to present.

You must appear to present your argument or the other side will automatically win. The Petitioner, Celeste Whitewolf, may then be given all that is asked for in the petition for Civil Complaint.

The petitioner will be present at the hearing. If you desire to personally argue your side of the case, you may have a legal side, spokesperson or attorney appear on your behalf at your expense.
