## Turn on your television with new wireless cable system

Within the last three months approximately fifty people in Warm Springs have become customers to New Image Products of Cable Innovations in Portland, Oregon. This is a satellite (wireless cable) system. The company has purchased their permit from the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs and is legally promoting their product here in Warm Springs.

New Image Products started business in 1986 as a mail order company for a national satellite distributor and is now the number one dealer of Direct Broadcasting Equipment in the northwest. Owner and founder, Michael Derwey quickly saw the possible market potential for the satellite industry in the 90's and started selling and installing satellite equipment in 1987.

Since 1986 the company has grown substantially, with gross sales for 1993 projected over two million dollars. New Image Products, Inc. has over 1000 satellite systems in operation today for both residential and commercial customers all over Oregon and in Washington.

New Image has received achievement awards from such major manufacturers as Toshiba, Echosphere, General Instruments and Houston Tracker. New Image has also received the number one Dealer Service Award from Echosphere Corporation and R S & I. Both of whom distribute a major portion of satellite equipment to dealers in the Western United States.

As well as being registered with Dunn & Bradstreet, New Image Products, Inc. is a member in good standing of the Better Business Bureau.

The company has most recently acquired exclusive franchise rights to Cable Innovations, a subsidiary of General Instruments Cable Innovations which is a new marketing and manufacturing concept that utilizes Direct Broadcast Systems, a new broadcast that allows people to receive cable directly into their home no matter where they live in the country.

Sales Manager Ron Fenner stated, "The company has the largest service staff on the west coast. All our technicians are highly trained, and we have twenty field representatives who travel to your homes." All employees are employed by the company, they are not independent contractors.

Their service department is open from 6:30 a.m. until 9 p.m., Monday through Friday and 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday. Fenner stated, "Someone is always here to help. Service is our number one priority."

The systems available come in three packages which start with the G-5 Basic that has 18 national channels, and costs \$1999, the custom system includes all satellites and is \$2488. While premium upgrade has all satellites as well, it includes a top of the line receiver, and a five year warranty, and the total cost is \$2888. All systems come with a receiver and remote. The price

includes the dish as well as the hook up. Their are approximately 6,000 movies and 7,000 live sporting events available on satellite. The representative will go over the total price with you and give an estimate of the monthly payments.

Approval of financing is based on

an individual's line of credit. Applicants must have a checking account. The company deals with about four finance companies who finance their customers. Applicants must have some form of credit. Of course, having major credit cards does help but the only requirement is having an

established checking account. Loans cannot be approved for bad creditors.

your medical needs. Call your local Adult and Family Services Division or Senior and Disabled Services Division office. They will tell you how to apply for medical help. You may also qualify for other programs with the State of Oregon Department of Human Resources Office of Medical Assistance Programs.

The Warm Springs Early Intervention and Early Childhood Special Education Programs offers these supportive services to families and children:

Pre-screen for Fetal Alcohol Syndrome referral.

Provide assessments and evaluations in speech, motor, developmental, social, behaviors and recommend interventions.

Parent as teacher program (PAT) to help parents be their child's best teacher for parents of eligible infants and toddlers.

Provide special assistance in classrooms meeting needs of children with disabilities.

Assist families in securing other services such as SSI, child care,

medical referrals, CORP referrals; provide medical mileage as needed and follow-up. Also counseling for families related to child's disability.

Assist children and their families with eating nutritional difficulties.

Help develop a parent FAS Support Group and other interest groups.

Julie Quaid is the Director of Early Childhood Education in Warm Springs. Coordinator of Early Intervention is Jane Kirkpatrick. Staff are: Infant Outreach, Barbara Poncho; Early Childhood Special Education (3-5), Becky Brunoe and Nancy Yubeta; Physical Therapist, Dorothy Robinson-Foldes; Speech Therapist, John Gale and Bonnie Shepherd.
